Treasurer's Report July-November (4 months of FY 2017)

Overall:

This report is a four month snapshot of FY 2017. The Village receives a relatively small amount of revenue in the first four months of the fiscal year with the most prominent being the first major installment of the real estate tax revenue and tax duplication payment that comes from the county in the amount of \$100,524. We have a budgeted deficit of 46,117, and it is still too early to project how we will end up in relation to this number by the end of the year. Our FY 2016 audit is officially completed and available on the Villages website. In addition the full audit of incorrect addresses and misallocated revenues is also complete and available for anyone who wants to view it at the office.

Income Tax Revenue:

We received our share of the 2014 and before of delinquent taxes in October in the amount of \$47,946. While this is a good deal more than we received last year, it is not an indicator of our annual tax revenue and we will not have any significant income tax information until the end of November.

Property Tax Revenue:

We received \$336,883 in October. We project this to come in at budget since the Village approved the constant yield for FY 2017.

Safe Speed Net Revenue:

So far this year it is trending about 22% below budget for the first four months. There has been some construction during the first couple of months which has had some impact on safe speed citations; otherwise there is not one concrete reason for the decline in revenue so far this fiscal year.

Miscellaneous Revenue:

As of now it is tracking slightly above budget. We received a tax duplication payment of \$100,524, which was about \$15,000 above the budgeted amount.


Capital Expense:

Our expenses are projected to be \$227,500 and so far the projects we have begun is street maintenance and the purchase of a new skid steer for public works.


Operating Expense:

Dear Board Members,

I am a long-time resident of the Village who frequents the park with my dog. In fact, I am there almost every morning enjoying the company of my neighbors while our dogs play. I was interested to see the beautiful plans for the park that have been circulated to abutting neighbors, and am delighted that some attention will be paid to it upkeep in the near future. The notice that was posted last week, however, caused me concern.

I have gotten to know many neighbors, both from the Village and from the surrounding municipalities over our shared interest in our dogs. I would also note that over the 25 years I have been a resident of the Village I can count on my hands the number of times I have seen anyone who is not a dog owner using the park. It remains empty most of the day after the dog owners leave, usually by 10am.

I am not sure what the issues are that have caused the use of the park to be reconsidered, but I can assume it has to do with noise or wear and tear on the grounds. Those of us who use the park would be happy to address the issues if we knew what they were. Those owners who have dogs who bark excessively should be more vigilant (and need to understand that this is annoying to all involved) and those whose dogs are "diggers" must be made to understand that that behavior is unacceptable and causes unnecessary maintenance.

The "Gazebo Park" in Section 3 is a good example of a well-maintained dog park that also serves non-dog-owning residents. It has restricted hours and is re-sodded twice a year to maintain its attractive appearance. Whether it is used by anyone other than dog owners is not clear, but by limiting the times dogs are allowed in the park the Section Manager assures that the interests of those who own dogs are balanced against those who do not. Since the Brookville Park is never utilized by residents other than dog owners, I do not believe that similar restrictions are necessary, but at least a similar arrangement could be considered for the use of the Brookville Park.

Rather than taking away a positive use of the park that strengthens community bonds, a compromise could easily be reached so that everyone in the community would be able to use the newly renovated park in the future. While I am not convinced that non-dog-owners will use a park located on such a heavily trafficked road, I certainly would be in favor of sharing the park with my neighbors who do not have dogs, or those whose dogs prefer not to socialize in the park. Following an appropriate period of observation, to the extent that the park is not utilized by non-dog owners, any time restrictions can simply be lifted.

Thank you for your careful consideration of the use of the park. I look forward to attending the meeting on November 14.

I will likely not be able to attend the public hearing on Brookville Road Park Nov. 14, but very much want to express my strong opinion and desire that this little triangle of land remain a dog park, and that off-leash use be permitted unless a dog is seen as acting dangerously aggressive, or the owner does not carefully monitor the dog's actions, especially in the interests of cleaning up poop. In my experience, people who bring their dogs to this little haven have been very vigilant and proactive about bad behavior and clean-up infractions, and completely forthright in calling an owners' attention to a problem and insisting it be remedied. I have never seen an owner of an off-leash dog refuse to put the dog back on-leash if someone complained that the dog was too aggressive, even if the dog was just playing. Every time I have seen an owner not paying attention to a dog pooping somewhere in the park and have called the owner's (or walker's) attention to the issue, the reaction has been remorse and embarrassment and the mess has been cleaned up immediately. What happens when no one is around to notice is a problem on every street and in every park.

I have found that residents with dogs love this little haven and frequently make new friends here -- as do the dogs. It's a small nook (and really, the triangle shape makes it quite small) where no dog is ever out of sight.

I don't know what other uses are being considered for the park, but there are many parklike areas around Chevy Chase with playgrounds for children. (For example, although technically across the border in Chevy Chase, DC, the recently renovated Lafayette Park on Broad Branch Rd, has a vast playground, with all sorts of fun contraptions in sections set aside for toddlers and older youngsters. There is a paved path for walking and pushing strollers, loads of benches, picnic tables, and field areas for little kids' athletics, plus new expansive tennis courts.

Dogs can be walked in Lafayette Park, but off-leash is not permitted, and though some owners do it anyway, the area is not enclosed and too large to assure a safe environment for dogs and children in the same spaces.

Brookville Road Park, while a rare little dog haven, has not been well-maintained and can be extremely muddy and rutted. It's still a wonderful special place for dogs and people to mingle in a safe and intimate setting, in a very simple old-fashioned kind of way.

Please don't take this away from our neighborhood.

Dear Village Managers/Board Members:

I hope to make the open meeting next week regarding the "Triangle Park" at Brookville and Quincy, but in case I am unable to make the meeting, I thought I should send my comments also via email.

I was excited to hear that the Village is considering investing in some landscaping for the Triangle Park. This park is one of the wonderful features of the Village that make being a resident of the Village so special. I live close by on Bradley Lane, and I primarily use the park as a place to bring our dog and socialize with other Village residents. I have met many neighbors at the park whom I otherwise would likely not have met. I have even had a chance to occasionally catch up with close neighbors in a casual way in the morning and evening. I wave at friends I see running on Brookville while I am in the park. In general, the park has created a stronger sense of community amongst neighbors.

While a dog may occasionally bark out of excitement to spur on other dogs to play, all the dogs I've encountered at the park are well behaved and there is very little noise coming out of the park - certainly no more when I have been there than the general barking one might hear in neighbors' backyards. Their owners are responsible to pick up after their dogs, and I have never had to deal with a mess in the park.

While having a nice pristine open space between homes is nice, it would be a shame if the park is vacant without community life. Allowing for the community of dog owners to actively use the park, and to be responsible to self-police behavior in the park, seems consistent with the close community feeling that makes Chevy Chase Village such a special place.

Dear CC Village Board Members,

When our family first moved to Quincy Street, our children and others from the neighborhood regularly enjoyed playing at the "Quincy Street Park." Both children and adults would congregate there on summer evenings, weekends and for a snowball fight on snow days.

Sadly, I haven't seen a child in that park in several years. Even children walking past the park often cower as several large dogs come running toward the sidewalk, jump up & bark at passers by.

When we first bought our house we researched the park, wanting to make sure it wasn't just an empty lot that would be developed. In fact, we were told that it had been purchased by a group of Village residents to be kept as a park for the enjoyment of Village residents

Today, the only people who enjoy the park are those with large dogs. At many times of the day and evening, several large dogs are tearing around the park, barking and chasing one another. Yes, some of these dog owners are my neighbors and for the most part they are very good about keeping their dogs from barking incessantly.

However, the majority of the people using the park are dog walkers who drive up and park in front of my house, let as many as half a dozen dogs out of their car, then take them to the park where they let them loose to run and bark while they sit on the bench and read emails or smoke. It happens from early until late. The park must be on a "best place to let dogs run loose" list somewhere because the number of dog walkers just keeps growing.

There is a sign telling people to keep their dogs leashed but I haven't seen a dog on a leash for quite some time.

Last week a woman was standing in front of my house while her dog pooped on the grass in front of our sidewalk. She cleaned up after her dog and apologized to me, saying she had hoped

to take her dog to the park but, "No one with a small dog can go into the park with all the large dogs running loose."

Last Saturday I was awakened before 7am by the loud barking of two enormous dogs chasing each other and barking constantly while a man drank his coffee & read his newspaper. Most Sundays another man brings a very large dog to the park early and lets it bark without any concern. And during any weekday, there are as many as 10 large dogs tearing around the park at various times of day, barking and ripping up what's left of the grass.

In short, the park has become a nuisance. It is no longer a place where children or many adults feel safe even during the middle of the day. It is attracting a large number of non-Village residents and no one obeys the leash rules.

The noise caused by packs of large dogs is terrible and many of the dog owners seem insensitive to the fact that they are in a neighborhood and the noise might be bothering other residents. They arrive early in the morning, apparently believing it is a place where their dogs are free to bark nonstop.

The park is obviously an eye sore but with packs of dogs tearing around, it's impossible to maintain ground cover.

I urge you to take down the "dog fence" and return the park to a place for the enjoyment of all Village residents. I'd encourage you to add some play equipment or other features that help return the park to its original intent, a green space that everyone can enjoy.

I have complained on several occasions to the CC Village staff and police so I'm disappointed that the board has so far taken no action. I will be collecting the signatures of others in the neighborhood since apparently their complaints have not had an impact either.

If there is some dispute about the situation, I hope you will open this issue up to discussion at an upcoming meeting.

Hello,
Thank you for allowing me to comment on the use of the park.

I live in Martins Additions, just a few blocks from the park. I jog by it several times a week with my dog and am not happy to see it used by unleashed dogs, which it is a good percentage of the time I go by. I once called the appropriate agency to let them know about the unleashed dogs, but it seemed like a hassle, as I do not carry a phone while jogging, and I was told that I needed to call that agency when I saw unleashed dogs there. The main reason I do not like to see unleashed dogs there is because that is the place that my dog was bitten, by a fairly small dog that was able to jump the fence and bite him. And so every time I go by there, I am hoping I can make it through without one of the dogs hopping the fence again to bite my dog. At that point on Brookville Road, there is no sidewalk on the other side so I am forced to walk right by the park and sometimes large dogs come running over. One time a very small dog went under the fence to bite my dog and it then ran into Brookville Road with its owner after it. I have seen dog walkers park opposite the park and come in with 1 or 2 dogs. I have personally used the park with my dog just so he can come in right near the gate and smell and do his business and then we leave, all the while on a leash, of course.

So, if the park were to "become" a dog park, I think that there should be very restricted hours for when dogs can be unleashed, perhaps 45-60 minutes at a specified time in the morning and afternoon, with other times patrolled so that the park is not abused at other times.

I would imagine that there are some people who either do not like dogs, or do not like aggressive or dirty dogs going up to them, if people just want to use the park. And I think that the park should be returned more to the people, and not just those with dogs. So another option is to not allow dogs at all. However, this would require strict patrols too. There is a clear sign that says there is a \$100 fine for bringing in unleashed dogs, and that has not seemed to stop anyone.








Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)



By Day of Week




Weekday vs Weekend
