

Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for December 2011 within Chevy Chase Village






Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)



By Day of Week




Weekday vs Weekend

**December 2011
Crime Activity**

Friday, December 16, 2011

Overnight from Thursday, December 8 to Friday, December 9 we had two thefts from vehicles:

1. West Irving Street between Magnolia Parkway and Cedar Parkway. The car was parked in the driveway and unlocked. Loose change and prescription sunglasses were taken.
2. West Kirke Street between Laurel Parkway and Magnolia Parkway. The car was parked in the driveway and it appears that it was unlocked. A backpack, laptop computer and cell phone were taken.

On Friday, December 9 between 7pm and 10pm, three cars were broken into at the Mormon Church (5460 Western Avenue). One window was shattered on each vehicle. One of the cars was parked in the 5500 block of Kirkside Drive; a purse was taken from the passenger side floor which contained a cell phone, credit cards and other items. The other two cars were parked in the church parking lot, and the Montgomery County Police documented those incidents as they are outside of the Village. The owners of all three cars were attending evening services at the church.

This is the time of year when thefts typically increase. Please remember to remove all valuable items from your car and lock it at all times.

Friday, December 23, 2011

1. As you may have heard, one of our officers—Deng Tan—was involved in a collision on Thursday, December 15 at about 7:30 p.m. Thankfully, she is fine—a little sore, but otherwise fine. The other motorist received a minor facial cut and was otherwise fine, as well.

The collision was not her fault. Officer Tan was driving north on Brookville toward East-West Highway when a minivan pulled out from the stop sign on westbound Thornapple right in front of her cruiser. The collision forced the cruiser to veer left into a curb, then into a retaining wall and a fence. The police car overturned and came to rest on its roof in the middle of Brookville Road.

The Montgomery County Police investigated the collision and cited the other driver. Officer Tan was taken to Suburban Hospital by ambulance, and after a thorough check up, she was released. She will return to work the week of December 26. We look forward to seeing her back in the Village.

2. On Thursday, December 22, 2011, Delonte Anthony Greenwald was arrested on the strength of a warrant by a joint task force of the Montgomery County Police and the Prince Georges County Police. Greenwald is alleged to have committed thefts from autos in the Village and he is believed to be responsible for burglaries in the area, as well. Beware of Copper Thefts

Across our region and across the nation, there has been a spate of copper theft. According to *The New York Times*, the price of copper has skyrocketed. Today, scrap copper brings a price of \$4 per pound. In 2009, the Times reports that the price was about \$1.25 a pound. Thieves steal copper pipe, electrical wire and downspouts from unoccupied homes; they steal electrical lines from below- and above-ground utilities; they steal copper tubing from air conditioning units from homes and commercial buildings; they will steal virtually anything that contains copper if they think they can get away with it.
