

November 2012 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational Items

1. **Thefts from auto:** There were 11 this month; all of them involved unlocked vehicles. 8 occurred in the early morning hours of Tuesday, November 20.
2. **Bait car:** We finally took possession of the car at the end of November, and we are going through the MVA titling and inspection process now. If all goes well, we will be having the electronics installed in the car before the end of December.
3. **Upfitting the Durango as an emergency vehicle:** Installation was completed over the 12/8-9 weekend.
4. **Two thieves arrested:** Village and County police collaborated to arrest 2 adults in the early morning hours of November 20. The male/female team admitted to entering and stealing from several cars. Multiple autos in the Village and in Section 3 were entered that night. Both are pending trial at this writing.
5. The new **in-car laptop computers** are fully operational and are working very well.
6. **House checks swelled** over the Thanksgiving holiday. They are expected to rise again as the Christmas and New Year holidays approach.

Training

1. Officer Chung attended a 40-hour course entitled Crisis Intervention which prepares officers to effectively communicate with people with special needs and those in emotional crises. The course was tuition free and taught by County HHS and MCPD.
2. Officers are nearly finished with their state-mandated in-service training requirements

Administrative

1. **New Criminal citation law takes effect 1/1/13:** Following several work sessions with allied public safety agencies, we have finalized our written policy to implement the new law and Chief Fitzgerald will be training every officer in the coming weeks.
2. **Annual inspections underway:** We are inspecting officers' firearms, equipment, lockers and file cabinets to ensure proper procedures are being followed. Thus far, we are in very good shape.








Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE_REC'D)
