

June 2013 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational Items

1. **Thefts from auto:** Three thefts from unlocked vehicles; two occurred overnight 6/3-6/4; one involved a contractor's truck during the daytime.
2. **Other thefts:** Three thefts occurred involving unsecured items near front doors: two events involved recently-delivered packages during the day; a third involved personal items left outside overnight
3. **Bicycle thefts:** In June, we started to receive reports of stolen unsecured bicycles. We are reminding residents to put their bikes away or lock them up (since detached garages were entered in two of the bicycle thefts, they must be classified as burglaries).

Upcoming

- **National Night Out (Tuesday, August 6, 6p-8p):** We have commitments from the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Rescue Squad, County Police (K9), and the fire department to have apparatus displays and demos at the event. The Village will be sponsoring free hot dogs, chips and drinks. We hope residents will join us.
- **Distracted driving enforcement:** The use of handheld cell phones while driving will become a 'primary' offense in Maryland on October 1 (texting while driving is already a primary offense). Village officers will be strictly enforcing this new law to minimize distracted driving.



Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for June 2013 within Chevy Chase Village






Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
