

January 2014 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational

1. **Attempted Burglary on Kirkside Drive; no entry made:** At about 4:30 a.m. on Saturday, January 4, Village and County police officers responded to the report of an attempted burglary in the 5600 block of Kirkside Drive. Investigation revealed that unknown person(s) broke a pane of glass in the basement door at the rear of the house. The sound of breaking glass alerted one of the home's occupants, and police were alerted right away. Village officers arrived very quickly, but the would-be burglar had already fled the scene. The investigation by Montgomery County detectives is ongoing.

2. **Ten unlocked cars entered—most on the same night:** In each case, the interiors of the cars were left in disarray, yet only three residents reported anything missing (loose change from only three cars). After rifling through the contents of the cars, the suspect(s) were careful to close the car doors quietly; in several cases, car doors were left slightly ajar. Streets included Center, Kirkside, Oliver and Grafton.

Administrative

1. **5 officers attended two days of excellent legal update training:** Taught by a senior lawyer/instructor from the Department of Homeland Security (he was outstanding), the training focused on the most recent court decisions dealing with Constitutional law and search and seizure. The training was free, and it was well worth the time spent.

2. **Meeting of the Public Safety Committee:** The PSC met on January 16; we reviewed items of importance since the last meeting and then briefly discussed the revenue and expense forecasts for the FY15 budget.

3. **2014 legislative session:** We are actively monitoring bills in Annapolis that may affect the Police Department.



Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for January 2014 within Chevy Chase Village





Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)




By Day of Week
