

# August 2014 CCVPD Highlights

## Crime/Operational

### 1. Three burglary events:

- **100 block of East Melrose:** Bicycle stolen from unlocked, detached garage
- **Unit block of East Lenox:** Residents discovered a broken window 5”x7” window panel; no entry, and nothing stolen. The home was alarmed.
- **5600 block of Belmont Avenue:** Shortly after resident left her home to go shopping, someone smashed a basement window to enter; nothing stolen. It is believed that the loud alarm resulted in the suspect leaving quickly.

### 2. Three theft events:

- **5800 block of Connecticut:** Unlocked car entered; nothing taken
- **Unit block of West Irving Street:** 2 unlocked cars entered; \$4 in loose change taken.
- **6100 block of Nevada Avenue:** 1 unlocked car entered; nothing taken.

## Administrative/Training

1. **Resignation of Communications Clerk:** After a year with the Village, Ms. Heidi Rottman has accepted a position as a police officer candidate with the M-NCPPC Park Police. Her last day with the Village was 8/28.
2. **New Communications Clerk:** Ms. Regina Cortez started with the Village on 8/18; following training, she will be assigned to the night shift (the vacancy created by Ms. Rottman’s resignation).
3. **National Night Out:** Fun was had by all. Many Village residents mingled with Village and county police officers, the Village Manager and staff, members of the B-CC Rescue Squad and county firefighters. For the second year, Mr. Saul Goodman was the grill master.
4. **New marijuana law becomes effective 10/1/14:** On August 26, Chief Fitzgerald and Lt. Dasilva attended a presentation by the State’s Attorney’s Office in which the SAO explained its policies and recommendations related to the law decriminalizing marijuana.



## Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for August 2014 within Chevy Chase Village






Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
