

October 2014 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational

1. **Daytime theft from open garage (classified as burglary) on 10/29.** At about 11:15 a.m., the resident of a home on W. Irving Street watched as a silver Dodge Durango SUV with Maryland tags backed completely inside his open garage. Two black males in their 30's wearing dark clothing got out of the SUV. They left when the homeowner confronted them. The resident discovered two power saws missing from the garage.

2. **Police discover unlocked cars entered at four homes on Hesketh overnight Friday, 10/10-Saturday, 10/11.** While on patrol shortly after 6:00 a.m. Saturday morning (10/11/14), Officer Timmerman spotted a car in the unit block of Hesketh Street with its trunk open and an interior light on. Upon investigation, Officer Timmerman located four other cars on that same block that appeared to have had their contents disturbed. A total of \$2 taken in all.

Administrative/Training

1. **CCVPD hosted Legal Advisors' Group meeting on October 10.** Chief Fitzgerald has been attending the monthly meetings for this group of professionals for almost 3 years. Village Counsel, Suellen Ferguson, participated.

2. **All Saints Fall Festival.** CCVPD was represented; Officer Timmerman staffed a table with informative literature and crime prevention giveaways.

3. **Several officers attend training:** In addition to attending the second day of required annual in-service training, we sent several officers to no-cost short courses on death investigation, perfecting the traffic stop, electronic investigation for patrol officers, and firearms training








Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
