

April 2015 CCVPD Highlights

I. Crime/Operational

1. Two burglaries; 2 suspects arrested in one of the events:

- **5900 block of Cedar Parkway:** On Monday, April 6, residents returned to their home after a weekend away to find that a side door had been forced open. Cash and jewelry were stolen.
- **5500 block of Western Avenue:** On Friday, April 10 at about 12:15 p.m., Village officers responded to an alarm call. Officers immediately saw that the back door had been kicked in, and they called for additional resources. While Village officers were investigating the crime scene, Montgomery County officers spotted two suspicious men walking nearby and they stopped the young men. The shoe print left on the door that was kicked in matched the sole of one of the suspect's shoes, and the pair was arrested.

2. Three thefts from unlocked cars:

- **5500 block of Center Street:** Overnight Thursday, 4/2-Friday, 4/3, a laptop computer and accessories were stolen from an unlocked vehicle in the victim's driveway.
- **5500 block of Park Street:** On Tuesday, 4/14 at approximately 1:00 p.m., wallets containing cash and credit cards were stolen from an unlocked car.
- **Unit block of E. Kirke:** Overnight Wednesday, 4/22-Thursday, 4/23, a laptop computer was taken from an unlocked car in the victim's driveway.

II. Administrative/Upcoming

1. **Resignation:** Officer Franklyn Sanchez, hired by the Village in April, 2011, has accepted a position with the Caroline County Sheriff's Office to be closer to his Delaware home. We will miss him and we wish him the best. We are actively recruiting to fill his slot, and to prepare an eligible list for the additional position that will become available on July 1.
2. **Policing in the 21st Century:** The State's Attorney, the Sheriff and the police chiefs in Montgomery County have begun a series of discussions in response to President Obama's task force report on policing in America.



Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for April 2015 within Chevy Chase Village






Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
