

# January 2016 CCVPD Highlights

## I. Crime/Operational

### 1. 3 thefts from unlocked cars:

- 6200 block of Western; parked in driveway; \$5 in change taken;
- Unit block of Hesketh; parked in driveway; nothing taken;
- W. Irving between Connecticut and Cedar; parked on street; iPhone 4S taken

### 2. 4 other thefts:

- A temporary license plate was removed from a car parked for a week near the intersection of Oxford and Summerfield;
- 3 political campaign signs were removed from the area of Newlands and Brookville;
- 2 laser-style holiday yard lights were taken from the lawn in the 3900 block of Oliver
- A bicycle was taken from an open garage on Hesketh between Cedar and Kirkside (this must be counted as a ‘burglary’ since the thief walked inside a building to take the bike)

### 3. Employees did a great job during the blizzard:

In advance of the storm, Public Safety Coordinator Jackie Parker and Sgt. Eric Tiedemann stocked the kitchen with food and beverages to keep the officers going during the storm. Once the snow started, Officers Davor Hrnjak, Deng Tan, James Timmerman and Joseph Chung, and dispatchers Beverly Etienne and Mary Gilligan worked through the storm and stayed locally at a hotel in between shifts. Everyone showed up and we had a full staff through the weekend (Fri., January 22-Sun., January 24). Nice job.

## II. Training/Administrative

1. **PERF Roundtable—Re-engineering the use of force:** Chief Fitzgerald attended this discussion with police officials from around the country that focused on developing training to teach officers how to safely de-escalate an encounter to avoid the use of force.
2. **Maryland Police Training Commission (MPTC) adopts body camera policy:** The MPTC adopted the recommendations—verbatim—from the ad hoc commission. The official policy is on their website.



## Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for January 2016 within Chevy Chase Village






**Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)**
