

October 2015 CCVPD Highlights

I. Crime/Operational

1. **Church burglar arrested in multi-agency effort:** In the first week of October, Village police identified a pattern of forcible church burglaries in which an unknown suspect broke in to at least 7 churches in Maryland and the District of Columbia. All Saints Church was burglarized twice. Village police alerted Montgomery County and DC police, and the County Police Department deployed a covert team as a result. On October 9, the County surveillance team arrested Mr. Freddie Hamlett, 49, of Washington, DC. He is facing charges in MD and DC.

2. **Officer Hrnjak stops resident’s significant bleeding:** On Friday, October 30, dispatcher Mary Gilligan heard Fire/Rescue dispatch units to an address in the Village for a person bleeding from the leg. Officer Hrnjak arrived at the location 90 seconds later—well in advance of Fire/Rescue. Officer Hrnjak applied direct pressure to the victim’s lower leg and stopped the profuse bleeding until Fire/Rescue could take over. Great work by the dispatcher and the officer.

3. **4 cars entered; 1 of them stolen due to keys left inside:** 2 unlocked cars were entered on Grafton Street (nothing taken from one; coins taken from the other); 1 locked car was entered by breaking a window; the handicapped placard was stolen from the rear view mirror; 1 unlocked car was entered on Nevada; the owners had left the keys in the console, and the thieves used the keys to steal the car; the car was recovered later the same day in Washington, DC.

II. Administrative/Upcoming

- **First annual speed camera report sent to legislature:** Sgt. Tiedemann did a fine job putting this together and submitting it ahead of the October 31 deadline.








Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
