

## **Treasurer's Report**

### **July-June (12 months of FY 2015)**

#### **Overall:**

This report is a 12 month snapshot for FY 2015 and not a final year-end report. That will be available when the annual audit is finalized. For FY 2015 we project a draw on reserves of \$240,000. The projected draw is \$585,401 less than budgeted. We have income tax revenue that is projected to come in 18% below budget and paving reimbursed money that arrived early and was included in the final FY 2014 results. These shortfalls will be offset by higher than projected State and County payments and higher than budgeted fees that are projected to be collected and slightly higher property tax revenues. In addition, the Village has made a decision to postpone some Capital Projects, the Laurel Park Engineering Hydrology Study, the Village wide street light project, and the Western Grove Park development. In addition, many projects have come in below budgeted amounts.

#### **Income Tax Revenue:**

We will be finishing the year at \$2,135,739 receipts, which will be 18% lower than budget. This is largely because the 2012 tax receipts (which we used as a base for estimating 2014 tax receipts) included significant one-time events that made those receipts higher than the true underlying trend. Because of the nature of our tax base, income tax forecasts have been historically been subject to these kinds of distortions.

#### **Property Tax Revenue:**

We are projecting coming in about 5-6% higher than budget. When we set the tax rate for FY 2015, instead of using the constant yield which gives you a certain revenue, the Village reduced the property tax rate by 15%. We based the budget on the previous year's property tax base. Due to a slight increase in property values, we will be slightly above budget in property tax revenue.

#### **Safe Speed Net Revenue:**

We project this will be coming in above the budgeted amount by approximately 9%. While there was a big drop in citations while Connecticut Ave was being repaved, there has been a rebound of citations and payments since.

#### **Miscellaneous Revenue:**

We project this to be approximately \$42,000 over budget due to a higher than anticipated County Duplication and Highway User payments and higher than expected permit fees.

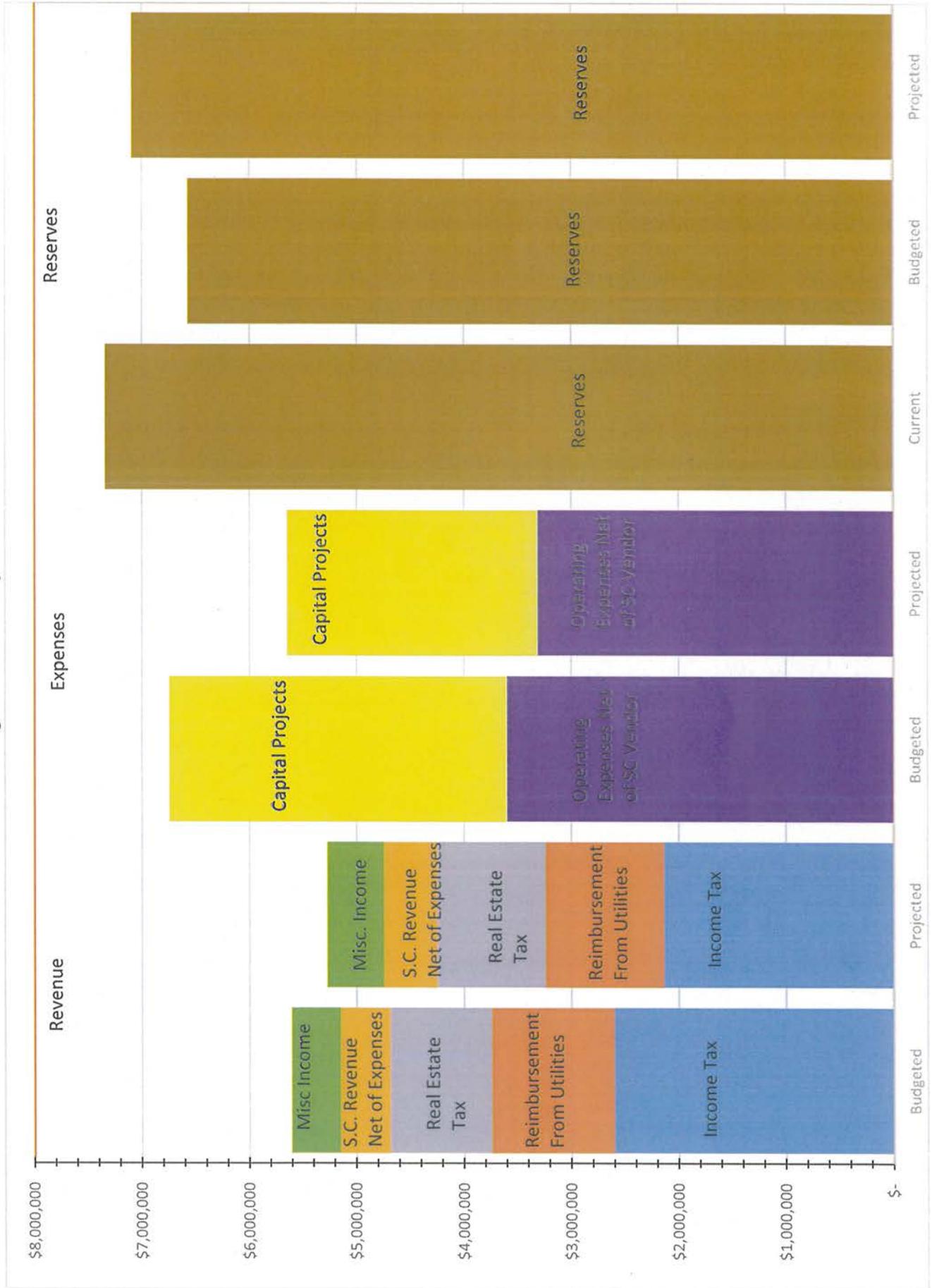
#### **Capital Expense:**

We project this will be \$839,000 under budget due to the street repaving and the purchase of the two new police vehicles being less than expected, decisions to postpone the Laurel Park Hydrology Engineering Study, and the development of Western Grove Park, and a decision not to proceed with the Village wide streetlight replacement project. Also, some projects came in below budgeted amounts.

#### **Operating Expense:**

We project this will be 6% below budget.
