### Budget Update Message from the Chevy Chase Village Board Chair

Dear Residents:

All over the country, state and local governments are facing budget shortfalls and difficult decisions. Chevy Chase Village is fortunate in having built a substantial “rainy day” reserve over the past several years. In fact, because our reserves have grown so large we have in recent years budgeted deficits to reduce them a bit, in order to keep property taxes from going up. Until this year, our revenues have always outpaced what we budgeted, making a draw on reserves unnecessary.

Our annual budget depends in large part on allocations by the State of a portion of residents’ income tax revenue. As a result, we are vulnerable to swings in levels of taxable income such as we have seen recently. This complicates our financial planning.

We now expect fiscal year 2010 Village revenues to be about 34% (\$1.6 million) below the record level achieved in FY 2009, chiefly as a result of lower taxable incomes. When developing the Village budget for the current year, we had anticipated only about half of this amount of revenue shortfall. So revenues are down.

And expenses are up. A number of unforeseen factors, largely relating to pending litigation and other legal expenses, have led the Board of Managers to approve supplemental appropriations this year totaling about \$190,000. Some further supplements are anticipated. The revenue shortfall, combined with these unexpected expenses, could result in a draw of as much as \$1.3 million on our reserves. We can easily handle this one-year impact, but we do not have the resources to absorb such losses on a continuing basis. Though at December 31 some \$3.5 million was still available, prudent financial management dictates that we set aside at least \$1 million of this amount, equivalent to three months operating expense, as a contingency reserve. Were deficits to continue at the present rate of \$100,000 a month, our present \$2.5 million net balance would be exhausted within two years.

Consequently, over the next several months the Board will be taking a particularly close look at all Village revenue sources and expenses to determine what adjustments can and should be made to return our budget to long-term sustainability. We anticipate also taking some short-term measures to contain expenses. As we proceed with these reviews, our priorities will be informed by the results of last fall’s resident survey. We also invite your comments and attendance at Board meetings as we plan and implement the necessary adjustments to regain budget equilibrium.


Dianna enjoys roller skating, architecture, smart growth and spending time with her dogs Bruno and Vixen.

## Creation of an ad hoc Permit Parking Committee

At its January 11, 2010 meeting, the Board of Managers held Public Hearings regarding three Permit Parking Petitions. One of the three petitions was denied and the other two petitions were tabled pending a review of the Village's existing Permit Parking Ordinance.

To assist in this review, the Board approved the formation of an ad hoc Permit Parking Committee. The Committee will review the existing Ordinance and how other similar communities have dealt with commuter and retail parking. Within the next six months, the Committee is tasked with making a recommendation to the Board for ways the Village's permit parking regulations might better meet the concerns expressed by residents.

## Sample Streetlight Installed

In the past two (2) Chevy Chase Village Resident surveys, residents overwhelmingly supported upgrading the street lighting throughout the Village. As a pedestrian and public safety initiative the Village is developing a plan to use a portion of the funds generated by the *SafeSpeed* program to enhance and upgrade the street lighting throughout the Village.

In order to assist residents, the Public Works Committee and the Board of Managers in the selection of adequate street lighting and to display the teardrop style “white light” fixture preferred by residents in the 2009 Chevy Chase Village Resident survey, PEPCO and the Village have installed a 55-watt induction (white light) sample streetlight located in the triangle park across from the Village Hall (at the intersection of West Kirke Street and Laurel Parkway).

At a future Board meeting, the Public Works Committee will seek the Board’s approval on a wattage and fixture for use throughout the Village. Once a fixture and appropriately light level has been approved, the selected fixtures would be installed throughout the Village. During the installation PEPCO and the Village will work hand-in-hand to survey the height and tree cover surrounding the lights to determine where lights may be able to be lowered on the existing poles to minimize tree impacts. Once the streetlights are installed, the Village in coordination with the Public Works Committee, will survey the new streetlight system to determine where additional street lighting will be necessary.

## Report from the Public Safety Committee on the Acquisition of Electronic Weapons for the Village Police

The Public Safety Committee held an open meeting on January 20, which was attended by all but two of the PSC members, four residents, the Village Manager and the Chief of Police.

The meeting focused on the Report of the Maryland Attorney General's Task Force on Electronic Weapons that included sixty recommendations for Maryland Law enforcement agencies to consider when purchasing Tasers.

## Village Police Help Find Lost Dog

Chevy Chase Village Police Officers Davor Hrnjak and Willie Hearn were instrumental in capturing "Jasper" a Rat Terrier recently adopted by a family in Chevy Chase, NW, DC.

A lost dog report on Jasper had been called in to the Chevy Chase Village Police on January 19, 2010. Jasper had been missing for 10 hours before the Village officers spotted him and captured him unharmed at the intersection of Brookville Road and Western Avenue.

Jasper's owners were thrilled when the officers returned him. A neighbor of the owners reported the following on the Chevy Chase DC Listserve, "I am in awe of the Village Police Department, which among other things, keeps a photo of residents' dogs on file so lost pets can be easily reunited with their owners."

## Unleashed Dogs/Excessive Barking Incidents & Complaints Rising

Residents and visitors are witnessing more dogs unleashed as they walk around Village Streets. Below is a summary of the Montgomery County Animal Control Laws. Village Police will take a more proactive approach to this problem by issuing a Warning Notice for first-time violators followed by a Civil citation for repeated offenses. Residents are asked to share this information

with their Dog Walkers, Dog Feeders, Housekeepers and Nannies who may have control over their pets when they are working or away.

Summary of Animal Control Laws:

**At Large:** Any dog is at large if it is outside the owner's premises and not leashed. **Wireless/remote leashes are prohibited and in violation of the "leash law"**. The fine is \$100 for the first offense, \$500 for each subsequent violation.

**Animal Noise:** An owner must not allow an animal to cause noise that is loud enough and persistent enough to disturb another person's quiet enjoyment.

**Unwanted Contact:** The pet owner must prevent unwelcome or unsolicited threatening physical contact or close proximity to a person or a domestic animal that occurs outside the owner's property that may cause alarm in a reasonable person, such as biting, chasing, tracking, inhibiting movement, or jumping. The fine is \$500.

**Animal Defecation ("pooper scooper" law):** An owner must not allow an animal to damage or defecate on property outside the owner's property. An animal may defecate on public property or the common area of property in which the owner shares an interest if the owner immediately removes and disposes of the feces by a sanitary method approved by the Director. Feces may be picked up in a plastic bag. If this bag is placed inside another plastic bag, it may be put out for disposal in your normal household trash. The fine is \$100.

**Animal Trespass:** An owner must not allow an animal to enter private property without the property owner's permission. The fine is \$100.

## Ethics Commission Vacancy

The Ethics Commission is chartered by the Village's Public Ethics Code (PEC) to serve as the advisory body responsible for: 1) interpreting the Village's PEC, 2) advising persons subject to the PEC as to its application, 3) hearing and deciding on advice of Village Counsel, any complaint filed regarding an alleged violation of the PEC, and 4) all forms (such as the financial disclosure form required to be completed annually by each member of the Board of Managers) submitted in accordance with the PEC. Last year, Commission Chair Reid Thompson resigned from the Commission after 16 years of service. With Mr. Thompson's resignation, there is currently one vacancy on the Commission. ## Water Main Replacement Presentation at February 8 Board Meeting

WSSC plans to begin replacing water mains installed in the 1930s that are in poor condition. The new larger, lined cast iron pipes will reduce water main breaks and improve water quality and pressure. WSSC representatives will make a presentation to the community at the Board's February 8 regular meeting. The presentation will detail what residents can expect during the replacement project. ## Snow Removal from Sidewalks and Streets

Residents are responsible for clearing all fallen snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of or abutting their property within the first forty-eight (48) hours after the cessation of precipitation. Residents who occupy corner lots are responsible for clearing sidewalks on all sides abutting their property. To assist the Public Works Department with its snow clearing from Village streets, please remove all vehicles from the street before a snow storm begins.

## Chevy Chase Center Plan Amendments

Recently, the Chevy Chase Land Company (Land Company) filed an amendment with the Montgomery County Planning Board to modify their existing approved development plan at the Chevy Chase Center.

As of the printing of this newsletter, representatives are scheduled to hold a public meeting to present the proposed plans on February 3. The Land Company has advised that the proposed modifications would include "enhanced seating areas, outdoor dining areas, additional landscaping and streetscaping, and other miscellaneous amendments to improve circulation and overall functioning of site improvements". 
