As outlined in the presentation, staff has proposed that the following sections of sidewalk be replaced, subject to Board review and approval, during the second year of this project:

- Cedar Parkway
- Grafton Street
- Primrose Street (between Connecticut Avenue and Brookville Road only)
- West Irving Street
- West Lenox Street
- West Melrose Street

These sidewalks have many areas that are in major disrepair, are uneven, have edges that have begun to fall away, missing bricks and up-heaved sections due to existing or former mature trees. In an effort to receive public comment on the proposed year 2 schedule for this project the public record will remain open until the June 11 Board meeting.

Please see the above-referenced page on the Village website to review the current project schedule, including streets completed in year 1, and the current staff proposal for year 2. Remaining sections of sidewalks, including those around the Village Hall and along the Belmont Buffer, are currently shown in year 4, but will be reassessed and subject to Board approval for replacement prior to the beginning of fiscal years 2014 and 2015.

Update on the Village's Pending Request for a Connecticut Avenue Pedestrian Crossing

As we reported in the April 2012 issue of the *Crier*, the Village has formally requested that the State Highway Administration install a pedestrian signal across Connecticut Avenue at Lenox Street. Since our request was submitted, several Village residents and many local elected officials have written the State Highway Administration (SHA) in support of our request, including Montgomery County Council Chair and County District 1 representative Mr. Roger Berliner, the Village of Martin's Additions Council, and Maryland State Delegates for District 18 Messrs. Alfred Carr and Jeff Waldstreicher.

Representatives from SHA met with members of the Village Traffic Committee and staff in mid-May to discuss progress on SHA's review of our request. SHA representatives advised that the request has been preliminarily denied for failing to meet the minimum criteria established by the Manual on Uniform Traffic-Control Devices (MUTCD), which requires that a minimum of 100 pedestrians attempt to cross a roadway within a single hour. The pedestrian count performed by SHA on March 1, 2012 failed to find this minimum number of pedestrians, which the Village Traffic Committee and Board had anticipated when the request was submitted. We continue to believe that our residents are not willing to take their lives in their hands by attempting to cross the avenue, and that many instead opt to cross by vehicle—adding to the growing traffic congestion. We have urged the State to include in its analysis data that we provided regarding use of the Village Hall and Post Office, mass transit patronage for the eight bus stops between Bradley Lane and Chevy Chase Circle, etc., which represents the pedestrians likely to cross the avenue if there were a safe way to do so. Unfortunately, it does not appear at this time that this data has been incorporated into SHA's evaluation of our request.

The Board of Managers will receive a briefing from the Village Traffic Committee and staff at the Board's next regular meeting scheduled for Monday, June 11 at 7:30 p.m. in the Village Hall. Proposed Policy Regarding the Planting of Trees in Public Rights-of-Way: A memorandum outlining the Tree Committee's proposed policy to regularize the procedures for the planting of trees in Village rights-of-way. The draft policy will be reviewed by the Board at its June 11, 2012 regular meeting. **Parks & Greenspaces:** Susan Kilborn of Oliver Street and Judy Elliott of West Irving Street were appointed as Co-Chairs. **Tree Committee:** Samuel Lawrence of East Lenox Street was appointed as Chair. **Tree Ordinance Board:** Julia Dahlberg of West Irving Street was appointed as a member and Samuel Lawrence of East Lenox Street was appointed as Chair. **Legal Services Committee: Board Assignment**—The Legal Services Committee was reestablished to recruit and recommend new legal counsel. Members of the reconstituted committee are Allison Shuren of Hesketh Street, Mary Sheehan of West Kirke Street, Robert Brewer of Grafton Street, and Richard Ruda of Newlands Street. Mr. Michael Denger will serve as the Board Representative. The Committee will select their own Chair.

Notice of Public Hearing: Tree Plantings in Public Rights-of-Way

The Chevy Chase Village Board of Managers will convene on **Monday, June 11, 2012 at 7:30 p.m.** to hold a public hearing to establish Village policy on the Village's planting of trees in public rights-of-way.

The Village has approximately 2,200 trees in public owned rights-of-way and parks, which are an important part of the Village's tree canopy and urban forest initiatives. Every year a number of trees need to be replaced. From time to time, residents have objected to the Village plantings trees on the public rights-of-way in front of or on the side of their property. The purpose of the hearing is to set forth Village policy as to the circumstances under which a resident's objection to the species or modifying the planting location would be recognized and to establish procedures for handling any such objections.

Comprehensive Review of the Village Building Code

The Board of Managers and Village staff have discovered inadequacies, confusing provisions, illogical order and discrepancies within the Village Code. These have led to a process that can be challenging for residents to understand and follow, and difficult for Village staff to administer and enforce. Additionally, there are substantive provisions in need of review.

At its regular meeting in May, the Village Board reviewed and approved a plan to create an ad hoc committee to perform a comprehensive review of the Village Building Code. The goal of this review is to modify the Code so that it meets the primary objective of preserving the core fabric of the community while being easy to understand, administer and enforce which will in turn yield regulatory compliance.

The Board will appoint members to the ad hoc committee at the Board's June 11 regular meeting. A copy of the project plan including a proposed timeline for the committee's review is available on the **Village website** by clicking on **Governance/Village Committees/ad hoc Building Code Review Committee**.

State Highway Administration's Proposed Sidewalk Along Wisconsin Avenue

Following the State Highway Administration's community meeting in late April, the Village Board and staff continue to examine the State's preliminary plans for the installation of a sidewalk along the east side of Wisconsin Avenue between Grafton Street and Bradley Lane. Pursuit of this proposed sidewalk is a complicated process involving the removal of several trees along this section of State Highway Administration-controlled right-of-way and major changes to the aesthetic of this corridor.

Be On Guard for Transient Criminals

These 'Travelers' are Thieves and Con Artists



It's springtime. The weather is delightful, the flowers are blooming, and the traveling crooks are on their way here (if they're not here already). These nomads work in groups that sometimes include women and children. They are masters of distraction, deception and fast talk.

Be wary of anyone who approaches you and offers to do any home improvements including driveway sealing, tree trimming, and roof or chimney repairs. They will often claim that the work must be done right away to avoid further harm/damage, and they will sometimes quote a price that sounds like a bargain. If you engage transient criminals to work on your property, they will likely do substandard work, overcharge you, 'discover' additional problems requiring more money, and perhaps they will 'lose' the check so that you will write another (they'll cash both).

At some point during the work, when you are distracted, one member of their team will enter your home and steal from you. Other distraction scams include the 'lost dog' ruse where two or more women will approach you while you are gardening and ask for your help locating their cute little dog that ran behind your house. As you accompany one of the women to your back yard, the other will enter your house and steal.

To protect yourself from these thieves, the Chevy Chase Village Police Department recommends the following:

- Keep your house locked when you are at home—especially when you are working outside.
- Decline all on-the-spot offers of home improvement services.
- Do not allow anyone to enter your property to look for a lost pet. Have them leave their phone number and tell them you will contact them if you see their pet.
- Call the Village Police immediately when a solicitor approaches you; we will respond right away and investigate the circumstances.

Smart Phones Are Targeted by Quick-Grab Thieves

Avoid 'Texting-While-Walking' for your Safety

DC is experiencing 'snatch-and-run' robberies of smart phones. The typical thief will approach a distracted pedestrian and will quickly grab the electronic device right out of the hands of the surprised victim, then run off. The thieves know that when a person is actively reading, texting or listening to music on a smart phone, they are highly distracted and inattentive to their surroundings, making such a crime very easy to commit. Additionally, please realize that distracted walking increases your chances of being injured by traffic or other hazards in your path. Please remain aware of your surroundings and avoid texting-while-walking.

Smooth Operator 2012 Will Begin Soon



Smooth Operator 2012, a statewide traffic safety enforcement effort, will begin soon and the Village Police Department will be participating. The program runs intermittently all summer long in five 1-week 'waves' of enforcement throughout the state. At least 50% of the time that our officers spend on this targeted enforcement campaign will be between the hours of 10pm and 6am.

Smooth Operator is a grant-funded program and the state will reimburse the Village for the time our officers spend during each enforcement wave. Village officers will be focusing primarily on four violations that are known to contribute to collisions:

1. Speeding,
2. Driving Under the Influence of alcohol or drugs,
3. Failure to use seat belts, and
4. Distracted driving.

Please do your part and make traffic safety the highest priority whenever you are driving. Don't speed, buckle up, drive sober, and have the will power to put all of your electronic devices away until you reach your destination.

Streetlights "Dark-spots"

In an effort to increase the level of street lighting along Village streets and rights-of-way, the Board has authorized the installation of additional streetlights in several locations throughout the Village. PEPCO has completed its design work and is in the process of installing the new lights. Installation of the new lights is scheduled to be completed by the middle of June. After these additional lights are installed the Village Police Department will be conducting a follow-up survey of the Village's streets to determine further "dark-spot" locations. Based on the follow-up survey, staff will present its findings to the Village Board for consideration to address any remaining "dark-spots".

With regard to the Chevy Chase Lake issues, current proposals under discussion would increase development density threefold from less than 500,000 square feet today to 1,500,000 when the Purple Line is built. The impacts on Connecticut Avenue and Brookville Road traffic will lead to further congestion and a spread of the rush hours we now experience. In addition there will be changes to the parking and type of retail currently enjoyed by residents. This is not to say that there will be some changes in development there that could enhance our enjoyment of the area.

The County Zoning Code revision, currently in its third year of study, will change the zone for every home in the Village. While many of the standards will remain the same, there will be changes which we need to understand and some of which are at odds with the quality of life we currently enjoy. Since the ability of the Village to regulate zoning issues is strictly limited, we need to follow this process and weigh in where our interests are at odds with the proposed changes. Moreover, changes in the development standards for the commercial spaces in Friendship Heights are significant and adverse. For example the current height of the Saks Fifth Ave. building is 52 feet, under the new scheme a new building could be up to 145 feet in height.

In addition, the County is so anxious to change some use standards in residential zones, particularly those close to Metro stations, it is proposing major changes to the number of dwelling units that can be placed on a single property and allowing a second structure to be built to house a rental unit. That "Zoning Text Amendment" is currently under review by the County Planning Board.

Several Village residents, including Village Board Chair Patricia Baptiste, W. Lenox St. resident Meredith Wellington and former long-time resident Julie Davis, have been closely monitoring these issues, but it is important that all of our voices be heard and that residents more fully understand what is at stake for us if some or all of these changes go forward. We will have a community meeting on **Tuesday, June 19 at 7:30 p.m.** in the Village Hall for residents to be fully informed about these issues. One outcome of the meeting will be to solicit volunteers to more fully follow these issues and to develop a community response to the changes proposed.



Chevy Chase Village 2012 Fall Public Tree Planting Notice



DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT: This upcoming fall 2012 the Village will be continuing its multi-year program, to enhance the Village tree canopy and to use vouchers provided by PEPCO to replace trees which it has taken down under power lines in the Village's right-of-way. PEPCO vouchers can only be used to purchase trees that do not reach a mature height greater than 35 feet. The Village's current plan is to plant 46 trees in the fall 2012 and another 45 trees in the spring 2013. These lists have been prepared by the Village Arborist in consultation with various Tree Committee members.

Below is a copy of the list of proposed planting sites for the fall 2012, if a tree is scheduled for planting near or in front of your home, you should check the specific planting site which will be marked with white paint and a blue flag. Also included, is a tentative list of sites for the spring of 2013, official notice for these sites will be sent out early in 2013.
