### Chevy Chase Lake Sector Plan Update

The Montgomery County Council is currently studying the recommendations of the Planning Board to make significant changes in the height, density and use of redevelopment at Chevy Chase Lake. The proposal before the Council would add 2.2 million square feet of added development including 1,400 new dwelling units. Building heights would be as high as 150 feet. These increases, which are significantly higher than recommended by the County's professional staff, would certainly change the character of the area, and would add to the traffic burden on Connecticut Avenue as well as Brookville Road.

# In The Village

## County Zoning Code Re-Write Moves Forward

The Montgomery County Zoning Code—which controls land use in the Village—is undergoing a major revision. For the last four years county planners and consultants have been engaged in a massive rewrite of the zoning code, the first in almost 40 years, recommending both format and substantive changes in the document that controls virtually every aspect of land use.

There is a disagreement among those following this revision as to how extensive the changes are for the residential zones. While the R-60 Zone (which controls the residential land in the Village) will retain the same designation, many of the protections previously contained in the code are being loosened. Other provisions, allowed but rarely used in the past, are being not only retained, but highlighted as allowed uses. The Village has limited control over height and setback and several other incidental development constraints but, other than covenants contained in the deeds for Village properties, the Village has little control over use.

Moreover, in addition to concern over changes to residentially zoned land, changes are also proposed for all commercial property. This will have a serious impact on the height and density of the commercial property abutting the Village in Friendship Heights.

On the evening of June 11<sup>th</sup> the County Council will hold its only public hearing on the 370 page zoning document. Council Committee work sessions will be held during the summer. No date has been set for Council final action. The Village will continue to monitor developments. A copy of the proposed revised Code is available for review in the Village Office. ## Residents Now Required to Maintain Abutting Right-of-Way

Earlier this year, the Board voted to eliminate contracted mowing on Village rights-of-way located between the sidewalk and curb (green strip) except for the area along Connecticut Avenue (which is a large State right-of-way, including a large area with double sidewalks along part of Connecticut Avenue).

**Residents and property owners are now responsible for maintaining the green strip area abutting their property.** The Village staff is sending reminders to households that have not yet mowed the green strip abutting their property to ensure they are aware of this new requirement.

Residents who need assistance mowing the green strip can reference the Village's Teen List (contained in the monthly hardcopy version of the Village newsletter, *The Crier*, or by contacting the Village office).

The traffic analysis prepared by the Council's staff agrees that the traffic would exceed current allowable limits. The Village has worked with our neighbors in an effort to keep redevelopment levels reasonable and to maintain the low rise, residential character of Connecticut Avenue.

In addition to the Village's efforts, it is **important that individual residents contact the County Council** as they determine the future of Chevy Chase Lake. If you are troubled by increased traffic through the Village and the very significant changes proposed at Chevy Chase Lake, please call or e-mail the Council. As outlined in the presentation, staff has proposed that the following sections of sidewalk be replaced, subject to Board review and approval, during the third year of this project:

- East Irving Street
- East Lenox Street
- East Melrose Street (between Connecticut Avenue and Brookville Road)
- Primrose Street (between Brookville Road and Oxford Street)
- Quincy Street
- West Kirke Street

These sidewalks have several areas that are in disrepair, are uneven, have edges that have begun to fall away, are missing bricks and/or up-heaved sections due to existing or former mature tree roots. Resident feedback on the proposed year 3 schedule for this project will remain open until the June 10 Board meeting.

Please see the earlier referenced page on the Village website to review the current project schedule, including streets completed in years 1 and 2, and the current staff proposal for year 3. Remaining sections of sidewalk, including those around the Village Hall and along the Belmont Buffer, are currently shown in year 4, but will be reassessed and subject to Board approval for replacement prior to the beginning of fiscal year 2015.

## Before You Leave For Vacation...

If you will be away from home for more than twenty-four hours, contact the Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to arrange for a house check. House check requests can also be submitted via the Village's website at [www.chevychasevillagemd.gov](http://www.chevychasevillagemd.gov). (click on "Police Services" under the "Police" tab.)

For added security, the Police Department recommends having mail held at the Post Office by completing PS Form 8076. In addition, if you expect a package from either UPS or FedEx, please leave a neighbor's address with the Communications Center so they may receive your packages.

The volume of packages and mail received in the Communications Center often exceeds the limited space available. Your assistance is appreciated.

## Noise Start Times Enforced

With the weather getting warmer, many residents are hiring landscape crews and other contractors to maintain and make improvements to their properties. These contractors typically like to start early so they can avoid the heat of the day.

Residents are encouraged to remind their contractors and landscape crews that the Village Code prohibits noise-generating activities prior to 8:00 a.m. weekdays and prior to 9:00 a.m. on weekends and holidays. The noise regulations are strictly enforced, and violators are subject to a municipal citation and fine.



## Recycle Old Cell Phones

Residents may drop off old cell phones **and** chargers at the Communications Center. The phones are wiped clean of any services, phone numbers, or address books. They are then re-programmed for victims of domestic violence or senior citizens so they may call 9-1-1 to report an emergency situation. They cannot be used for any other function.

## Smooth Operator 2013 Begins This Month



Smooth Operator 2013 is a statewide traffic safety enforcement effort and the Village Police Department will be participating. The program runs intermittently all summer long in four 1-week and one 2-week 'waves' of enforcement throughout the state. At least 50% of the time that our officers spend on this targeted enforcement campaign will be between the hours of 10pm and 5am.

Smooth Operator is a grant-funded program and the state will reimburse the Village for the time our officers spend during each enforcement wave. Village officers will be focusing primarily on four violations that are known to contribute to collisions and injuries:

1. Speeding,
2. Driving Under the Influence of alcohol or drugs,
3. Failure to use seat belts, and
4. Distracted driving.

Please do your part and make traffic safety the highest priority whenever you are driving. Don't speed. Buckle up. Drive sober. And please, please have the will power to put all of your electronic devices away until you reach your destination. Please.



## Leash Law Enforced

Many residents are enjoying the warmer weather by taking strolls through the neighborhood with their dogs. The Chevy Chase Village Police Department reminds residents that the law requires that all dogs be on a leash, otherwise they are classified as being "at-large." The law states that a dog must be leashed when outside the owner's premises unless it is a service dog, is in a place designated as a dog exercise area, or the dog is participating in a supervised dog activity such as a dog show. Fines for dogs off leash begin at \$100 for the first offense and go up \$500. The law also requires all owners/handlers to clean up after their pet.



The Village provides rear-door collection of refuse and recycling as a convenience to our residents. ## 2013 Fall Public Right-of-Way Tree Planting Notice



**DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT:** Please review the following list of 46 sites under consideration for fall 2013 plantings in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist. Later this month letters will be sent to residents at the addresses shown below to identify the specific species that the Tree Committee proposes for each site. Additionally, planting sites will be marked with white paint and a blue flag. Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns, or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee Chair, Sam Lawrence at [ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov](mailto:ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov) by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, July 8, 2013 including your name, address and telephone number. Mr. Lawrence will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In keeping with the Village’s adopted policy to fully utilize opportunities for planting tree in Village rights-of-way, the Village anticipates planting 45 trees this coming fall including planting sites along Connecticut Avenue and in parks which are not listed below. The list below calls out three (3) types of trees small, medium and large defined as follows:

- Small: Reaches a mature height of under 35’; species examples – trident maple, paperbark maple, Dogwood, Red bud, etc.
- Medium: Reaches a mature height between 30’ – 40’; species examples – American Hornbeam, Sawtooth Oak, Yellowwood, Japanese Zelkova, etc.
- Large: Reaches a mature height over 50’; species examples – Red Maple, Black Gum, Little Leaf Linden, White or Willow Oaks, Princeton Elm, etc.

In selecting tree species, an effort will be made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35’ when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this fall. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.
