Important: Roadway Repaving Notice

As residents are well aware the Village has been buzzing with activity over the past couple years with the various capital and utility infrastructure upgrade projects. Now that this work is coming to an end, the final phase is the repaving of affected roadways.

Beginning on Monday, July 7, the Village's paving contractor will begin the process of patching and repaving almost seven miles of Village roadways. The repaving work is scheduled to last approximately six weeks. A map outlining which streets are slated for repaving is available on the Village's website at www.chevychasevillagemd.gov by clicking on the "Capital Improvements and Utility Upgrade Projects" link under the "Quick Links" section and the "News" section.

As we enter the summer travel season, we ask those residents who plan to travel between July 7 and the middle of August to please park any vehicles that will remain in your driveway or on an unaffected street. During the repaving operations, "No Parking" signs will be posted on affected streets at least 24 hours prior to work commencing. If necessary, the Village Police Department will arrange and supervise the towing of parked cars to locations outside the work area.

As we move closer to repaving, additional notice including a paving schedule will be posted on the Village website, in the weekly general blast e-mail and delivered to affected homes on a street-by-street basis.

We thank you for your patience as we complete the final phase of the capital and utility infrastructure upgrades throughout the Village. Be a considerate neighbor (and comply with the Village Code) by mowing the grass and pruning back any overgrowth that interferes with pedestrian use of the sidewalks abutting your property. Clearing these obstacles will continue to make the Village pedestrian, stroller and bicycle friendly—and safe for all.

These sidewalks have several areas that are in disrepair, are uneven, have edges that have begun to fall away, are missing bricks and/or have up-heaved sections due to existing or former mature tree roots. A tentative schedule for this next round of replacements is available on the Village's website at www.chevy ChaseVillageMD.gov by clicking on the "Capital Improvements and Utility Upgrade Projects" link under the "Quick Links" section and the "News" section. Remaining sections of sidewalk, including those around the Village Hall and along the Belmont Buffer, are currently not scheduled for replacement, but will be reassessed and subject to Board approval for replacement in future fiscal years.

Park Development Update: Western Grove Urban Park

On May 22, the Montgomery County Council unanimously approved funding in the County's FY2015 capital budget for the final design and construction of the Western Grove Park. In partnership with the County, the Village Board of Managers has pledged to provide a 25% level of effort in funding to expedite the development of the Western Grove Park.

Now that funding has been approved for the park, Village and Park & Planning staffs are currently working to finalize design plans for construction and permitting. Construction on the park is anticipated to begin in late winter 2015. The Western Grove Urban Park is located between Grove Street and Western Avenue in the southwest corner of the Village, adjacent to Chevy Chase Center.

When complete, the park will provide residents with a tranquil park with a true urban vibe. The park will include the following: **two hard surface lighted walking paths; a naturalistic children's play area with stepping stone boulders, log seats, and a living hut of bent branches and a human sundial; low ornamental fencing along the Western Avenue frontage amidst a grove of existing trees to safely prevent children from dashing out into Western Avenue; a seating area with moveable furniture and water feature, and Wi-Fi access.**

While we await construction of the park's amenities, **THE PARK IS OPEN** and residents of the Village and surrounding communities are welcome and encouraged to use this wonderful area.

Chevy Chase Village Environment and Energy Committee's Ten Actions to Reduce Your Carbon Footprint

1. Change your light bulbs.

Replace your light bulbs with LED bulbs; they last a long time and do not contain Mercury.

2. Eat local foods.

Purchasing food locally cuts down carbon emissions of vehicles used to transport foods.

3. Plug your appliances and electronics into a power strip or unplug them when not in use.

Power strips can be turned off when not in use; this also reduces your energy bill.

4. Choose a laptop over a desktop.

According to ENERGY STAR a laptop can be up to 80 percent more energy efficient than a desktop.

5. Properly insulate your home.

Make sure that windows close properly and seal drafty areas.

6. Maintain your heating and cooling systems.

Proper maintenance will reduce the amount of energy used.

7. Reduce or eliminate your consumption of bottled water.

Use tap water with a filtration pitcher. Get a water tumbler and refill it.

8. Recycle all possible materials.

Recycling uses less energy and saves energy resources.

9. Buy energy-efficient appliances.

Pay attention to total lifetime costs. Look for the ENERGY STAR label.

10. Reduce your driving – walk, car pool or use Metro.

Stay Alert!

With schools being closed for the summer and an abundance of warm weather, please be mindful of children playing outside.

Remember to keep a sharp eye on your children when they are near a pool or any other body of water. According to the CDC, every day about ten people die from unintentional drowning (non-boating related) in the United States. Of these, two are children aged 14 or younger. That means that over 700 children 14 or younger drown each year in the U.S. Drowning ranks fifth among the leading causes of unintentional injury death in the United States.



The Village's Key Program only works if we have your house key. If you have not already done so, please return your house key in case you lock yourself out and so the Village Police can access your home in an emergency.

Before You Leave For Vacation

If you will be away from home for more than twenty-four hours, contact the Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to arrange for a house check. House Check Requests can also be submitted via the Village's website at www.chevy ChaseVillageMD.gov.



For added security, remember to either leave interior and exterior lights on or use timers to light up your residence as evening approaches.

The volume of packages and mail received in the Communications Center often exceeds the limited space available. Please try and limit package deliveries while you are away.

As a courtesy reminder, please try and limit trip hazards around the house. Officers will be walking around your home in the dark and may not be able to see toys or lawn ornaments.

The Chevy Chase Village Police Department will be focusing on aggressive drivers during the months of July through September as part of the statewide **Smooth Operator** initiative.



Remember: Don't Drive Distracted

'Hands free' means just that: You can't use your hands to hold your phone—even when it's on speaker

It seems that some drivers just can't help it—they just HAVE TO make or answer that call or read that text while they're driving. It seems that it's very much like a drug addiction. When that smart phone vibrates or makes a noise, some folks have no will power—they go to the phone the way Pavlov's dog reacted to the ringing of the bell. If this describes you, STOP IT! You are endangering yourself and others. It's selfish, it's unsafe, and by the way, it's illegal.

If you cannot trust yourself to refrain from handling your smart phone while you are in control of a vehicle, then either turn it off or put it out of reach before you start driving. If you absolutely must communicate using your smart phone while you are in your car, then stop in a safe place (a parking lot or a side street—NOT in a place that will impede traffic), put the car in 'park' and make/receive that communication. Please.

After receiving recommendations from the Traffic Committee and following a two-month public comment period, the Board adopted the majority of the staff’s recommendations. Some of the changes that residents will see include the following:

- Dirty signs have been power washed;
- Faded signs have been replaced;
- Bent sign poles have been straightened or replaced;
- Obstructions have been removed from several signs;
- Unnecessary ‘Neighborhood Watch’ and ‘Traffic Laws are Photo Enforced’ signs have been removed;
- ‘No Parking’ signs have been added to strategic locations near stop signs to keep intersections open; and
- Speed hump signs will be uniformly placed adjacent to the humps.



New Village Recycling “Toters” Coming Soon!

Order Yours Today

July 2014

At its June 9 regular meeting, the Village Board of Managers approved the purchase of new larger recycling bins called “toters.” The larger capacity will promote increased household recycling and will eliminate the need for residents to separate their recyclables into different bins. The new bins will be green in color with the Chevy Chase Village logo imprinted in white on the sides (see picture at right).



The new bins are expected to arrive by mid-July at which time the Village Public Works Department will deliver the new toter to residents’ homes, upon request. **To request delivery of the new toter email the Village office at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov with “Recycling Toter” in the subject line.** When the new toter is delivered, Public Works will take away your old recycling bins if you no longer want them. Discarded bins will be recycled.

Please note: Residents are not required to receive the new toters. Resident who choose to continue using the existing bins are able to do so, however, a very limited supply of the smaller bins will be maintained by the Village and future availability cannot be guaranteed..

As a reminder collection of recyclable metals, plastics, glass and mixed paper occurs every **Wednesday** for the **west** side of Connecticut Avenue and every **Thursday** for the **east** side of Connecticut Avenue. As with household refuse, recycling collection is from the rear of the premises; households are not permitted to leave trash nor recycling receptacles at the curbside.

The Village participates in a “single-stream” recycling program, meaning that all recyclables can be commingled and placed in the **Green** recycling toters. (Recycling materials must *not* be placed in plastic bags.)

The list of acceptable recyclable materials is constantly growing and a current list follows.

Commingled Glass, Metal and Plastics

- **Glass:** All jars and bottles (all colors).
- **Metal:** All aluminum and steel food and beverage cans and aluminum foil products such as balled foil wraps, and foil cookware. Please empty and rinse cans and foil products.
- **Plastics:** All plastic bottles can be recycled. Please empty and rinse bottles and discard the caps.


Mixed Paper

- Newspaper and all advertising inserts;
- Magazines and glossy paper products, mail order catalogs, etc.;
- Cardboard: cereal boxes, packing boxes, etc. (Please flatten large cardboard boxes and set with/beside the bin.)
- Telephone books, paperback books; and
- Plain paper, unwanted mail, computer paper.

All non-recyclable materials should be placed with the regular trash. To discard of bulk items, please contact the Village’s 24-hour Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to schedule a special pick-up. Special pick-ups are collected every Wednesday by our in-house Public Works Department. Requests for pick-up must be received by 2:00 p.m. on the immediately preceding Tuesday.

2014 Fall Public Right-of-Way Tree Planting Notice



DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT: In keeping with the Village's adopted policy, the Village anticipates planting 45 trees this coming fall. Please review the following list of sites under consideration for planting in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist.

Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee Chair, Sam Lawrence at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 25, 2014 including your name, address and telephone number. Mr. Lawrence will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In selecting tree species, an effort has been made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35' when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this spring. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.


“America’s Night Out Against Crime”
