VILLAGE BOARD APPROVES TREE PLANTING INCENTIVE PROGRAM, ENCOURAGING RESIDENTS TO PLANT CANOPY TREE SPECIES ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

Since the spring of 2012, the Village has aggressively planted trees in public rights-of-way to stay the loss of trees due to natural causes and weather events. These efforts have gone a long way toward maintaining the tree canopy so well-loved by the residents of and visitors to our community.

However, while the Village has increased the number of trees planted in parks and along public rights-of-way during the past several years, there has been a serious diminution in the number of trees on private properties due to disease and property development. Annually, approximately 75 trees are removed from private property that are 24 inches in circumference or larger. Recognizing the high rate of privately owned mature trees that are lost each year and that good planting sites in public areas are decreasing, the Village Board has enabled a new Tree Incentive Program for the planting of "canopy" trees on private property. This new program provides purchase cost-sharing assistance to residents who plant trees meeting specified requirements on their private property.

Under the new Tree Incentive Program, the Village will reimburse residents for up to half of the total costs to a maximum of \$175 for the purchase and planting of qualifying canopy trees on privately owned properties. The total gross cost (including sales tax) will be calculated before any other state, county or other subsidies are applied. Qualifying canopy tree species include White Ash, American Linden, Red and Sugar Maples, various Oak (White, Swamp White, Shingle, Willow, Water, Scarlet and Red), American Sycamore, London Plane, Bald Cypress, Sweet and Black Gum, American Beech, disease-resistant varieties of American Elm, Kentucky Coffee and Tulip Poplar. Finally, purchased trees must be two and one half inches (2 1/2") in caliper or greater at the time of planting to qualify for the incentive.

The Village Board has budgeted \$7,000 for the initial year of this program, effective July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. Residents interested in receiving reimbursement under the program

RESIDENT FEEDBACK REQUESTED: LED STREETLIGHT PILOT PROGRAM

In a continuing effort to improve the street lighting along Village streets and rights-of-way, the Village Board has authorized installation of LED streetlights as part of a Village pilot program to test the light output of this new technology.

Thus far only 27 feedback forms have been received by the Village. The feedback you provide is critical in evaluating the adequacy and appropriateness of this lighting within the community. Feedback can also be submitted by e-mail to ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov. Resident feedback along with an evaluation of the light output and dispersion by a professional lighting engineer will be transmitted to the Village Board later this fall with a recommendation for possible changes to the Village's street lighting.

must complete an application (available on the Village website and in the Village's administrative office). Applications will be acted upon in the order they are received. Any applications received after the Village has expended its \$7,000 annually budgeted allotment for this program will be carried forward into the following year.

Additionally, applicants for Tree Removal Permits will be refunded their permit filing fee if they plant a canopy tree within six months of receiving a Village Tree Removal Permit.

CHEVY CHASE VILLAGE CONTINUES EFFORTS FOR A PEDESTRIAN SIGNAL ON CONNECTICUT AVENUE AT WEST LENOX STREET

In March, then-Chair of the Chevy Chase Village Board of Managers, Ms. Patricia Baptiste, appointed an ad hoc Pedestrian Safety Committee to continue efforts to obtain a pedestrian-activated traffic signal to allow pedestrians to cross Connecticut Avenue at Lenox Street. The signal must be approved by the State Highway Administration, which has denied the request stating that the area currently lacks the minimum number of pedestrians seeking to cross the avenue in accordance with thresholds that the State uses to determine if a signal is warranted. Although the Village has argued that residents of and visitors to the area are not attempting to cross given the current unsafe conditions, but would undoubtedly seek to cross if there was a safe way to do so, the State continues to point to the failure to meet the warrants as insufficient basis to proceed with the installation of a signal.

In July, the ad hoc Pedestrian Safety Committee sent a letter to the State Highway Administrator, Ms. Melinda Peters, reaffirming the Village's request, and reiterating the unique factors that exist along this corridor that should serve as the basis for the State's approval of our request. BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS & CHILDREN

It's that time of year; summer has ended and children are headed back for another year of school. In order to ensure every child's safety, please remember and practice the following important tips:



- * Don't drive distracted. Put aside the electronic devices and fully focus on driving. Using a handheld cell phone while the vehicle is in motion will earn you a citation.
- * Don't drive distracted. Five seconds is the average time your eyes are off the road while reading or sending a text. When traveling at 55mph, that's enough time to cover the length of a football field blindfolded. (www.distraction.gov)
- * Don't drive distracted. Don't let anything divert your attention and scan the road ahead for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- * Failure to stop for a stopped school bus with flashing red lights carries a \$570 fine and three points. Village officers will be increasing patrol of school bus stops to catch violators.
- * Parents of children who ride the bus to school should take an active role in ensuring that children are transported to and from school safely and promptly, and that discipline and safety are maintained at bus stops.
- * Please check the times, locations, and route numbers for your child's bus. Make note of any schedule changes which have been implemented for this year. Route numbers are displayed on the side window of each bus.
- * If you have a concern regarding the operation of a Montgomery County school bus, please contact the MCPS transportation office at (301) 840-8130 or the Safe Schools Hotline (301) 517-5995.
- * If you witness an unsafe driver in the Village, note the tag number and report it to the Village Police Department.

If you were out of town during the summer months, please remember to visit the Communications Center to collect your mail and packages.

PET ID PROGRAM

Village officers continue to retrieve stray pets in the neighborhood. In late 2000, the Village Police Department began its Pet ID Program. To participate, residents simply submit a photograph and short bio of their pet. When a stray pet is found, Communications staff will review the Pet ID files to reunite the pet with its family.

The Pet ID Program only works if your pet's information is included in our pet album. If you have not already done so, please complete the Pet ID Program enrollment form available on the Village's website under the "Forms" tab or in our offices for ALL of the pets in your home (including dogs, cats, birds, ferrets, guinea pigs, hamsters, rabbits, etc.).

Pets that cannot be identified are turned over to the Montgomery County Animal Shelter. Digital photos can be emailed to ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov. Additional forms are available in the Village office.

MOVING? EXPECTING A LARGE TRUCK DELIVERY?

Residents are encouraged to contact the Communications Center to have temporary 'No Parking' signs installed in front of their home when moving out of

the Village or when expecting a large truck delivery.

"No Parking" signs will be posted at least one day prior to the move out or delivery date as a courtesy to notify neighbors that the parking spaces are needed to accommodate a large truck for a specified period of time as posted on the signs.



New Village Recycling “Toters” Have Arrived!!!

Order Yours Today

September 2014

At its June 9 regular meeting, the Village Board of Managers approved the purchase of new larger recycling bins called “toters.” The larger capacity will promote increased household recycling and will eliminate the need for residents to separate their recyclables into different bins. The new bins will be green in color with the Chevy Chase Village logo imprinted in white on the sides (see picture at right).



The new bins have arrived and the Village Public Works Department is currently delivering the new toters to residents' homes, upon request. **To request delivery of the new toter email the Village office at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov with “Recycling Toter” in the subject line.** When the new toter is delivered, Public Works will take away your old recycling bins if you no longer want them. Discarded bins will be recycled.

Please note: Residents are not required to receive the new toters. Resident who choose to continue using the existing bins are able to do so, however, a very limited supply of the smaller bins will be maintained by the Village and future availability cannot be guaranteed..

As a reminder collection of recyclable metals, plastics, glass and mixed paper occurs every **Wednesday** for the **west** side of Connecticut Avenue and every **Thursday** for the **east** side of Connecticut Avenue. As with household refuse, recycling collection is from the rear of the premises; households are not permitted to leave trash nor recycling receptacles at the curbside.

The Village participates in a “single-stream” recycling program, meaning that all recyclables can be commingled and placed in the **Green** recycling toters. (Recycling materials must *not* be placed in plastic bags.)

The list of acceptable recyclable materials is constantly growing and a current list follows.

Commingled Glass, Metal and Plastics

- **Glass:** All jars and bottles (all colors).
- **Metal:** All aluminum and steel food and beverage cans and aluminum foil products such as balled foil wraps, and foil cookware. Please empty and rinse cans and foil products.
- **Plastics:** All plastic bottles can be recycled. Please empty and rinse bottles and discard the caps.

Mixed Paper

- Newspaper and all advertising inserts;
- Magazines and glossy paper products, mail order catalogs, etc.;
- Cardboard: cereal boxes, packing boxes, etc. (Please flatten large cardboard boxes and set with/beside the bin.)
- Telephone books, paperback books; and
- Plain paper, unwanted mail, computer paper.

All non-recyclable materials should be placed with the regular trash. To discard of bulk items, please contact the Village's 24-hour Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to schedule a special pick-up. Special pick-ups are collected every Wednesday by our in-house Public Works Department. Requests for pick-up must be received by 2:00 p.m. on the immediately preceding Tuesday.


