CHEVY CHASE VILLAGE BOARD OF MANAGERS REELECTED; MEMBERS SWORN IN AND OFFICERS SELECTED

At the start of the Village Board's June 8 regular meeting, the Clerk of the Circuit Court, Ms. Barbara Meiklejohn, conducted the Oath of Office ceremony, swearing into office reelected members Mr. Gary Crockett (Grafton Street), Mr. Richard Ruda (Newlands Street) and Mr. David Winstead (Kirkside Drive), and newly elected member Ms. Minh Le (Oliver Street). Members serve for two-year, staggered terms.

Ms. Le joins the Board after having served previously as Co-Chair of the Community Relations Committee and of the former Committee on Children, Youth & Families. Ms. Le also previously served on the ad hoc Democratic Process and Good Governance Committee, which was established to create a more transparent Board election and appointment process. From this role, Ms. Le was amongst the first residents appointed to the Elections Committee (now the Election Supervisors), which has overseen Village elections since 2010. SUPREME COURT RULING TO IMPACT VILLAGE REVENUES

In-mid May, the U.S. Supreme Court rendered a decision in an income tax law case originally brought forward by the Wynne family of Howard County, Maryland. The court ruled in favor of the Wynnes and all Maryland taxpayers who were not allowed to claim credit against the local (county and municipal) portion of their Maryland taxes for income taxes paid in other states. This ruling will require some refunds to taxpayers from income tax distributions that the Village received in the past few years, and will reduce the income tax distributions we receive in the future.

Income tax is the Village's largest source of revenue, so the Village Board and staff have been watching this case throughout the appeals process. Now that the decision is final the questions become how much we will have to pay for past overcharges and how much less we should expect to receive from future income taxes. We are in close contact with the Maryland Comptroller's office, which is handling the calculation of liability for each municipality and developing a process and schedule for the required payments. We expect to have final details on all this by the end of this calendar year.

We do, however, have enough information now to be confident that the Village's reserves are sufficient to absorb the required reimbursements, and we will work closely with the State to determine the long-term impact on future Village budgets.

REPLACING OR INSTALLING AN AIR CONDITIONER?

Whether replacing an old unit or adding a new one associated with a construction project, both Montgomery County and **Village permits are required to install or replace all air conditioners, heat pumps, generators and geothermal systems.** Setback requirements apply for the location of external unit(s). Village staff will gladly advise you throughout your permitting process. SUMMER REMINDER: NOISE REGULATIONS

The Village reminds residents that use of lawn mowers, leaf blowers and other power landscape is **prohibited** between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. weekdays, and between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on holidays and weekends.

Please advise your landscape crews of these noise regulations, which are strongly enforced by the Village Police and Code Enforcement Coordinator.

MAINTAINING VILLAGE RIGHTS-OF-WAY

Residents and property owners are reminded that **you are responsible for maintaining the green strip area abutting your property**, except for the area along Connecticut Avenue (which is a State right-of-way, including a large area with double sidewalks along part of Connecticut Avenue). The Village staff will be sending reminders to households that have not yet mowed the green strip abutting their property to ensure they are aware of this requirement, established in spring of 2014. Residents who need assistance mowing the green strip can reference the Village's Teen List (contained in the monthly hard-copy version of the Village newsletter, the *Crier*, or by contacting the Village office).

Take a walk around your property. Are all of the public sidewalks surrounding your property clear of low-hanging branches, overgrown bushes and vines? Is the grass in the right-of-way and tree box area mowed and maintained at less than ten inches in height? Does any shrubbery block sight lines for vehicles?

Be a considerate neighbor (and comply with the Village Code) by mowing the grass and pruning back any overgrowth that interferes with pedestrians' use of the sidewalks abutting your property. Clearing these obstacles will continue to make the Village pedestrian, stroller and bicycle friendly and safe for all.

VILLAGE FOOD-WASTE RECYCLING (COMPOSTING) PROGRAM

HOW IT WORKS? The Compost Crew will provide each participating household with an airtight bin and compost-able bags. Each household only needs to separate organic waste, just as we already do with our plastics and paper, and to leave the composting bin by your refuse/recycling bins on the designated day of the week. The waste will be processed at a composting facility in Maryland. After six months of service, each household can request that a portion of its contributed waste be returned in the form of rich, finished compost or nutrient-rich soil if desired.

WHAT CAN BE COMPOSTED and WHY? As a rule of thumb, anything that grows or is made from the earth can be placed in a compost bin. This includes meat, dairy, vegetable and fruit scraps, coffee grounds and filters, tea and tea bags, egg shells, breads and other grains, napkins, paper towels, pizza boxes, dryer lint, etc. By diverting the compost-able portion of our solid waste away from the landfill and returning nutrients to our soil and food system, we significantly reduce our carbon footprint and greenhouse gas emissions. HOW MUCH DOES IT COST? The price for subscribing as an individual household is \$34.23/month. No long-term commitment is required. Going forward, and depending on the number of participating Village households, The Compost Crew WILL offer long-term discounted rates ranging between \$18.23 - \$22.23/month. All services will be directly billed by The Compost Crew to the participating household.

CAR SEAT INSPECTION INFORMATION

It can be a challenge to install a child car seat correctly, and if it is not done right, your child could be at risk of injury in a collision. If you could use some help to make sure you've installed the seat correctly, the specially-trained technicians at Fitzgerald Auto Mall will inspect your child safety seat for free.



From March through December, on the third Thursday of each month, Fitzgerald Auto Mall conducts free inspections from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on a first-come first-served basis at one of their stores; check their website (<http://www.fitzmall.com/Community/ChildCarSeat>) or call 301-548-4847 for the specific location.

If you are unable to attend one of the monthly inspection events, you can schedule a one-on-one appointment via the Fitzmall website (above). Individual appointments are scheduled Tuesday through Thursday at the Gaithersburg, White Flint, Wheaton, and Annapolis locations. The inspection is always free, though there may be a small charge for tether installation.

The next scheduled Child Seat Inspection Event will be on Thursday, July 16, 2015 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Fitzgerald Auto Mall—White Flint. The address is 5501 Nicholson Lane, Rockville, Maryland.





2015 Fall Public Right-of-Way Tree Planting Notice



DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT: In keeping with the Village's adopted policy, the Village anticipates planting between 30 and 40 trees this coming fall. Please review the following list of sites under consideration for planting in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist.

Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee Chair, Sam Lawrence at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, July 31, 2015 including your name, address and telephone number. Mr. Lawrence will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In selecting tree species, an effort has been made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35' when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this fall. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.
