SMALL STAFF RESPONDS TO A MIGHTY STORM; KUDOS TO NEIGHBORS-HELPING-NEIGHBORS

We would like to take a moment to acknowledge the small, dedicated staff that reported for duty during the Blizzard of 2016. As most of you know, Village streets are cleared by our in-house Public Works Department staff. The Village does not bring in any contractors for snow responses. Our Public Works Department staff consists of Public Works Supervisor (and a 30+ year employee of the Village) Jerry Lesesne, William Abernathy (a 20+ year employee), Luis Galindo, Richard Graves, Clarence Ricks (a 25+ year employee), Ernest Scott (a 20+ year employee) and Department Director Michael Younes.

Our Public Works staff reported for the extended deployment mid-day on Friday, January 22 and they worked around the clock through the early morning hours of Sunday, January 24. This required they leave their own families for three days over a weekend to ensure roadways remained accessible and safe. This work was done without the large trucks and equipment used by other local jurisdictions. Our smaller vehicles required our crews to work throughout the storm so that snow did not accumulate to the point of being unmanageable.

CONTACT THE VILLAGE BEFORE BEGINNING ANY WORK TO VERIFY PERMITTING REQUIREMENTS

Residents are reminded to contact Permitting & Code Enforcement Coordinator Ms. Ellen Sands BEFORE beginning ANY work on your property to confirm what if any permits may be needed. Depending upon where you live in the Village, work performed on your property may require permits from the Village in addition to permits from Montgomery County and/or the Historic Preservation Commission.

Work requiring permits from Chevy Chase Village includes:

- New buildings and additions to existing buildings including the main house, garages, accessory buildings and sheds;

In addition to Public Works, our Police and Communications staff also worked through the storm. These included Police Chief John Fitzgerald, Police Lieutenant Adventino Dasilva, Police Officers Joseph Chung, Davor Hrnjak, Deng Tan, James Timmerman, and Communications Clerks Beverly Perkins-Etienne and Mary Gilligan. Many of the Public Works, Police and Communications staff stayed locally at a hotel since travel to and from their homes to the Village was impossible on Friday and Saturday.

We also acknowledge the diligent efforts of our residents, many of whom promptly cleared the sidewalks abutting their properties and several of whom took time to check in on elderly and infirm neighbors who were snowed in. We also applaud the army of teens and able-bodied adults who cleared sidewalks, walkways and driveways for their neighbors.

Because of everyone's efforts, Chevy Chase Village streets were far more safer and passable than those of neighboring jurisdictions.

PEPCO TREE PRUNING

Beginning on Wednesday, January 27 and lasting the next few weeks, PEPCO representatives will be surveying trees on private property and in public rights-of-way to determine where tree pruning operations will be necessary. This tree pruning continues efforts began five years ago in response to mandates from the Maryland Public Service Commission to all Maryland utilities regarding vegetation management and system upgrades.

When PEPCO conducts pruning on privately-owned trees they are required to notify the resident of their intentions. When PEPCO is planning to remove trees they are required to receive signed authorization from the respective residents. If you are contacted by PEPCO because they wish to conduct tree pruning and/or removal operations on your property you have the right to request additional information on the requested pruning and/or removal.

As a homeowner you also have the right to refuse PEPCO crews access to your property. However, you should be aware that not maintain trees on your property can result in a loss of power to you and your neighbors in the event of a storm.

PEPCO's scope of work for these improvements will include tree trimming along the following streets and in rear yards where high voltage power lines exist:

- Cedar Parkway
- West Irving Street (between Cedar and Magnolia Parkways)
- Hesketh Street (between Cedar and Magnolia Parkways)
- Grafton Street (between Chevy Chase Circle and Cedar Parkway)
- Oliver Street
- Grove Street
- Center Street
- Montgomery Street
- Park Street
- Belmont Avenue
- Kirkside Drive

Following their review of the above areas, Village staff along with the Village's contracted consulting arborist, Dr. Tolbert Feather, Ph.D., will meet with PEPCO representatives to review the proposed tree pruning plans.

While past pruning efforts from PEPCO have resulted in concerns about the resulting aesthetic of the Village's tree canopy, through our meetings with PEPCO we have been able to focus pruning operations to a strategic and minimalist—rather than blanket—approach which has been reviewed and approved by Dr. Feather. Throughout this cycle of tree pruning, both Village staff and Dr. Feather will continue to oversee the tree pruning operations.

Once approved, tree limbs will be pruned to a minimum distance of 4-years of tree growth, based on the species of the particular tree being pruned and its expected growth rate. Trees may be pruned between two feet (2') and five feet (5') from the power lines. PEPCO plans to trim both private and public trees in the above listed areas. If PEPCO is going to conduct tree pruning on private property a door hanger from PEPCO will be left on your door outlining the extent of the pruning scheduled along with a business card for a PEPCO representative.

PEPCO has begun their survey work and should begin pruning operations before the spring. Should you have any questions regarding PEPCO's tree pruning, please do not hesitate to contact the Village office at (301) 654-7300 or via e-mail at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov.

PEPCO plans to complete all proposed pruning by spring.

TAX RETURN REMINDER

Revenues received through our residents' paid income taxes remain the most significant source of Village revenues. We need our residents' help to ensure that all income tax revenue due to the Village actually gets here. This money goes directly to services benefiting Village residents.

As Village residents you DO NOT pay any additional income taxes to live in Chevy Chase Village. By law, as a municipality, the Village receives a portion of the tax you pay to Montgomery County. It is very important, however, that the State of Maryland knows to return this revenue to the Village.

When you file your Maryland income tax return, please remember to type **Chevy Chase Village** under "City, Town or Taxing Area" to ensure the Village receives our share of the state income tax.

DID YOU STAY INFORMED?

During the recent blizzard, Chevy Chase Village staff updated residents regarding plowing operations, trash and recycling collection adjustments and office closures. We also circulated information regarding roadway conditions and who to call if your power went out. Did you receive this information? If not, then you need to enroll in the Village's general and urgent email blasts, two of the communications tools that the Village uses to communicate timely information with residents.

- **General Email Blasts** include information regarding community events, Board of Managers' meetings, class schedules, etc. and are sent out every at the end of each week. General blast emails are also sent when there is non-urgent but timely information that needs to be circulated to the community.
- **Urgent News Alerts** are only sent out as needed and include notice of power outages, water main breaks, major Village-service interruptions, office closures, etc.

Residents may subscribe to these email blasts by visiting the homepage of the Village website at www.chevychasevillagemd.gov and clicking on the small white envelope under the Village logo on the left-hand side of the homepage. **Note:** All subscription requests are verified by Village staff to confirm residency prior to approval. - Play equipment—including anchored basketball hoops and trampolines;
- New and expansions of existing decks, patios and terraces, tennis courts, swimming pools and outdoor therapeutic baths;
- New and widened driveways and walkways or the replacement of existing;
- Installation of new or replacement fences, walls, antenna, air conditioning units, heat pumps, generators, and geothermal systems;
- Any work that could alter existing water flow or drainage; and
- Any work in the public right-of-way abutting private property.

For work that requires only permits from Montgomery County and/or the Department of Permitting Services, applicants must first obtain a municipality letter from the Village Manager prior to filing their application.

BOARD OF MANAGERS ELECTION

Three Board seats will be up for election this spring. The current Board members whose terms are expiring in June are Michael Denger, Robert Goodwin and Elissa Leonard. All three incumbents have expressed their intention to run again.

Any Village resident may run for a seat on the Board provided he/she is a qualified voter in Montgomery County, has resided in Chevy Chase Village for one year prior to the election and files the required Certificate of Candidacy and Financial Disclosure Statement in proper form. Please note that the Certificate of Candidacy was only introduced last year. Board members serve two-year, staggered terms. If the number of qualified candidates equals the number of available seats, the candidates will be declared elected at the Annual Meeting on Monday, April 18, 2016 (the meeting begins at 7:30 p.m.). If the number of candidates exceeds the number of available seats, a contested election will be held on Saturday, May 7.

Village Election Supervisors oversee Village elections, including receiving nominations to serve on the Board of Managers. Residents interested in running for a seat should please contact Election Supervisors Chair Charlotte Jones-Carroll by email at cjonescarroll@aol.com so that the Elections Supervisors can begin to plan for the election.

To qualify as a candidate, an individual, including sitting Board members, must submit to the Village office a completed Certificate of Candidacy along with a Financial Disclosure Statement, at any time after February 6 (90 days prior to Election Day), but by no later than April 7 (30 days prior to Election Day). Upon receiving both completed forms, the Village Manager will submit the Financial Disclosure Statement to the Village Ethics Commission, which will review the form within ten days of filing for compliance with the provisions of the Public Ethics Code. Please note, however, that candidates are not certified to appear on the ballot until the Certificate of Candidacy and Financial Disclosure Statement have been reviewed and determined to be filed in proper form. CHILD CAR SEAT INSPECTION INFORMATION

It can be a challenge to install a child car seat correctly, and if it is not done right, your child could be at risk of injury in a collision. If you could use some help to make sure you've installed the seat correctly, the specially-trained technicians at Fitzgerald Auto Mall will inspect your child safety seat for free.



From March through December, on the third Thursday of each month, Fitzgerald Auto Mall conducts free inspections from 10:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on a first-come first-served basis at one of their stores; check their website (<http://www.fitzmall.com/Community/ChildCarSeat>) or call 301-548-4847 for the specific location.

If you are unable to attend one of the monthly inspection events, you can schedule a one-on-one appointment via the Fitzmall website (above). Individual appointments are scheduled Tuesday through Thursday at the Gaithersburg, White Flint, Wheaton, and Annapolis locations. The inspection is always free, though there may be a small charge for tether installation.

The next scheduled Child Seat Inspection Event will be on Thursday, March 17, 2016 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Fitzgerald Auto Mall—White Flint. The address is 5501 Nicholson Lane, Rockville, Maryland.

Cancellation Policy: When school is in session, if Montgomery County Schools are either delayed or cancelled, the inspection event will be cancelled.

SAFE WALKING HABITS: PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IS A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

We often see residents walking in the streets of the Village. In order to increase pedestrian safety, please familiarize yourself with the below 'rules of the road' for pedestrians:



State law requires pedestrians to use the sidewalk where one is provided and otherwise available. Please use our newly refurbished sidewalks whenever you can.

When a sidewalk is absent (or its use is impractical for any reason) and pedestrians must walk on the roadway, state law requires that pedestrians walk on the left side of the street—facing oncoming traffic. It is not only the law, but it is common sense for your safety. This is an especially important rule for those who listen to electronic devices as they walk; these devices reduce a walker's ability to hear and perceive approaching cars, trucks, bicycles, and the like.

WEEKLY POLICE BEAT AND EMAIL BLAST

FILING DEADLINE FOR COUNTY TAX CREDITS FOR HISTORIC PROPERTIES IMPROVEMENTS MADE IN 2015 IS APRIL 1

Owners of homes in the Village's Historic District can apply for both County property tax credits (25%) and State income tax credits (20%) for eligible home improvements. The County program is limited to exterior features of the property and the State program includes both interior and exterior features. Some examples of potentially eligible improvements include painting; window and siding restoration; and professional service fees such as design fees and structural evaluations.

In order to be eligible for tax credits, before beginning any physical improvements, residents should check with the County's Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) to find out whether the HPC requires a permit and they should seek approval from the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT). After the work is complete, the deadline for County tax credit applications is April 1 of the following year.





Proposed 2016 Spring Public Right-of-Way Tree Planting



DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT: In keeping with the Village's adopted policy, the Village anticipates planting 45 trees this coming spring. Please review the following list of sites under consideration for planting in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist.

Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee Chair, Sam Lawrence at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, March 4, 2016 including your name, address and telephone number. Mr. Lawrence will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In selecting tree species, an effort has been made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35' when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this spring. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.
