IMPROVED REPORTING OF VILLAGE FINANCES

The Village Board and staff continuously look for ways to improve communication with residents of the community. Our most recent effort in this regard is a reformatting of the Treasurer's Report—a monthly report issued by the Village Board Treasurer, in coordination with the Village's Finance Director—which provides a month-end and year-to-date summary of the Village's finances, including revenues, operating expenses, capital expenditures and reserve levels. The Village's financial books are kept on a "cash basis", meaning that we book revenue when we receive payments and we book expenses when we pay them. This keeps our accounting costs reasonable, but it means that at any given time our books may not give the best available description of our financial position. The new Treasurer's Report adjusts the book numbers to reflect our best projections of revenues and to reflect expenses we know have been incurred but not yet paid. This gives us a more realistic picture of where we stand financially.

The monthly Treasurer's Report begins with a narrative description of the Village's finances from the start of the fiscal year (July 1) through the end of the preceding month. The report begins with a basic summary followed by a summary of the status of our primary revenue sources—income and property tax and *SafeSpeed* Program citation payments (photo speed enforcement)—and of operating and capital expenses. This narrative is followed by a series of graphs that reflect the budgeted revenue and expenses compared to the current projections in each of the same categories. The graphs also reflect the current, budgeted and projected levels for Village reserves.

RECYCLE OLD CELL PHONES

Residents may drop off old cell phones and chargers at the Village's 24-hour Communications Center.

Donated phones are wiped clean of any services, phone numbers, or address books. They are then re-programmed and provided either to victims of domestic violence or senior citizens so they may call 9-1-1 to report an emergency situation. These phones cannot be used for any other function.

CHANGES TO THE VILLAGE'S ALARMS ORDINANCE

As announced in the October issue of the *Crier*, the Village's Alarms Ordinance has been revised and no longer requires residents to obtain a permit and decal for the operation of an alarm system in the Village. Instead, residents must register their alarm system with the Village's Communications Center, at no charge. Alarm companies must still be registered, through Montgomery County's False Alarm Reduction Unit, in order to operate within the County.



SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR OF DOUBLE-DIGIT THEFT REDUCTION!

While crime in the Village continues to be low overall, our most prevalent crime category is theft. After a spike of 97 thefts during 2012, the Village Police Department embarked on a door-to-door crime prevention campaign in early 2013. With help from our residents, theft numbers dropped to 60 in 2013—a 38% decline from 2012. And as of this writing (December 17, 2014), we have had only 38 thefts in 2014—a 37% reduction over last year. This represents a 61% overall reduction since the peak of 97 thefts just two years ago. The below table shows how our crime totals compare over a six-year period.

As you can see from the table, burglaries (unlawful entry into a home with the intent to steal) increased this year. While the total number (8) is within the normal range historically, we are not satisfied with this statistic and we will be working to reduce that number in 2015.

There is no doubt in my mind that the above reduction in thefts is at least partially due to our residents 'hardening the target' so to speak. We urge you to do your part to prevent crime in the Village. Failing to do so effects the wider community by providing continuing opportunities for criminals. We feel that crime prevention is a civic responsibility, and by doing a few simple things, you can prevent crime on your block.

- Always lock your home and cars and set your alarm if you have one
- Remove valuables from your cars
- Turn on your porch lights and leave them on through the night
- Request a house check when you are going away
- Call the police immediately when you see anyone or hear anything that just doesn't seem right. Village officers will respond right away and investigate.

MEDICATION DROP BOX AVAILABLE AT THE VILLAGE HALL

The Village Police Department has a grant-funded steel drop box for the safe disposal of unwanted/unneeded prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medication. The white mailbox-style receptacle is located in the hallway to the left of the lobby area in the Village Hall and it is available to residents 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Residents are welcome to drop off bagged prescription and OTC pills (if in their containers, obliterate names on the labels). No liquids, needles, or empty pill bottles please!





Please review the following list of sites under consideration for planting in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist.

Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee Chair, Sam Lawrence at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, February 6, 2015 including your name, address and telephone number. Mr. Lawrence will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In selecting tree species, an effort has been made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35' when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this spring. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.
