NEW VILLAGE WEBSITE LAUNCHED

The new website, developed together with website developer, CivicPlus® and feedback received from the Board, residents and staff, is designed to be more user-friendly and chock-full of information. The new website features a mobile-friendly display, online service requests and tracking, and the ability to submit permits and Hall reservations online with the option to pay filing and rental fees via a credit card. Lastly, the site features a more responsive content search engine, making it easier for visitors to find the information they really need.

The new site integrates much improved blast email and social media functions by allowing residents to customize the types, frequency and methods (email and/or text) by which you receive updates and information from the Village. A mailer containing more information regarding the new site, including instructions on how to sign up for various alerts and notifications, will be mailed to all Village households in early September.

Residents are encouraged to visit the new web site and provide staff with your feedback by emailing the Village office at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov or completing the website feedback form located on the site in the "Form Center".

We hope residents enjoy the new website and find it to be a useful resource.

RESIDENTS REMINDED TO COMPLY WITH LOCAL "SIGNS" ORDINANCE

Chevy Chase Village has its own "Signs" Code (Chapter 12) which outlines a series of regulations and parameters for signs erected in the Village, both on private property and in the public right-of-way.

The regulation of signs is intended to enhance pedestrian and vehicular safety and to preserve the attractiveness of the streetscape. Key provisions include:

- Signs allowed on private property, with certain limitations, including political and religious signs, flags, and scholastic or collegiate banners; *no permit is required.*

- Signs allowed on private property and/or in certain locations within the public right-of-way: real estate signs—both the wooden yard signs and for open house events; location signs for estate and yard sales; and directional signs intended to guide or direct vehicular or pedestrian traffic; *Village sign permit required for each sign erected.*
- Commercial signs are not allowed within the Village. (Exception: security/alarm system signs, which are allowed within certain size and location parameters.)
Commercial signs include: fence company name plates, attached to new fences containing the fence company's name, such as "LONG FENCE"; and construction or contracting company signs. Commercial signs placed in the public right-of-way will be promptly removed by Village staff. If a commercial sign is observed on private property, notice will be provided by Village staff to the property owner requesting prompt removal.
- An "electronic pet containment system" (i.e., electric pet fence) sign, issued by the Village, must be posted at each property where said system is in operation.

UPDATES RE: PROPOSED REDEVELOPMENT AT THE COLLECTION CHEVY CHASE

Several residents attended the special meeting called by the Board on August 1 to finalize the Board's position statement to the Planning Board regarding the proposed redevelopment at The Collection Chevy Chase, formerly referred to as Chevy Chase Center. The Board thanks the community for its input. EFFORTS TO ADDRESS TRAFFIC BACK-UPS ALONG WESTBOUND WISCONSIN CIRCLE

At the Village Board's Special Meeting held on August 1 to discuss the proposed redevelopment of The Collection Chevy Chase (formerly referred to as Chevy Chase Center), many residents expressed concerns that aspects of the proposed redevelopment might further exacerbate the traffic backups on westbound Wisconsin Circle. One of the existing factors that contributes to these delays is the lack of a right turn arrow onto northbound Wisconsin Avenue.

Wisconsin Circle is a County-controlled roadway. Although the traffic signal is within the public right-of-way for Wisconsin Avenue, which is a State road, the traffic signal is operated by Montgomery County, however, any additional turn signals must be approved by both agencies.

Village officials have already begin to reach out to the appropriate county- and state-level officials to have the intersection evaluated for the installation of a right-turn signal from westbound Wisconsin Circle onto northbound Wisconsin Avenue. More information regarding these efforts will be included in future issues of the *Crier* and on the Village website.

- A segment of fence installed parallel to and eight (8) feet east of the front (Connecticut Ave.) lot line running from the north property line southward for a distance of sixty-eight (68) feet; and then
- The fence would turn at a right angle eastward and extend twenty-one (21) feet terminating at the house. Seventeen (17) feet of this proposed segment would be located between the front (Connecticut Ave.) lot line and the twenty-five (25) foot front (Connecticut Ave.) BRL; and
- A segment of fence measuring five (5) feet in height extending from the north termination of the first section of fence seventeen (17) feet eastward to the front (Connecticut Ave.) BRL (and then continuing to the east property line) - *continued*

BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS & CHILDREN

It's that time of year; summer has ended and children are headed back for another year of school. To ensure every child's safety, please



remember and practice the following important tips:

- Don't drive distracted. Put aside the electronic devices and fully focus on driving. Reading or sending any communication with your smart phone — even while stopped — will earn you a citation.
- Don't drive distracted. Five seconds is the average time your eyes are off the road while reading or sending a text. When traveling at 55mph, that's enough time to cover the length of a football field blindfolded. (www.distraction.gov)
- Don't drive distracted. Don't let anything divert your attention and scan the road ahead for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- Failure to stop for a stopped school bus with flashing red lights carries a \$570 fine and three points. Village officers will be increasing patrol of school bus stops to catch violators.
- If you witness an unsafe drive in the Village, note the tag number and report it to the Village Police Department.

RECYCLE OLD CELL PHONES

Residents may drop off old cell phones and chargers at the Communications Center. The phones are wiped clean of any services, phone numbers, or address books and they are then re-programmed for use by victims of domestic violence or senior citizens so they may call 9-1-1 to report an emergency situation. They cannot be used for any other function.



If you were out of town during the summer months, please remember to visit the Communications Center to collect your mail and packages.

PLEASE LOCK YOUR VEHICLES



The vast majority of our thefts are those from unlocked cars. We make it far too easy (and inviting) for thieves. The Village Police Department urges you to lock your car doors every time you park. Remove all valuables— or hide them at the very least. Please do your civic duty and reduce the opportunities for thieves by locking up!

SAFE WALKING HABITS: PEDESTRIAN SAFETY IS A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

We often see residents walking in the streets of the Village. To increase pedestrian safety, please familiarize yourself with the below 'rules of the road' for pedestrians:

State law requires pedestrians to use the sidewalk where one is provided and otherwise available. Please use our newly refurbished sidewalks whenever you can.

When a sidewalk is absent (or its use is impractical for any reason) and pedestrians must walk on the roadway, state law requires that pedestrians walk on the left side of the street—facing oncoming traffic. It is not only the law, but it



is common sense for your safety. This is an especially important rule for those who listen to electronic devices as they walk as these devices reduce a walker's ability to hear and perceive approaching cars, trucks, bicycles, and the like.

OUR KEY PROGRAM ONLY WORKS IF WE HAVE YOUR KEY!

If you have not already done so, please consider participating by bringing in a copy of your house key in case you or a family member gets locked out and so the Village Police can access your home in an emergency. The Key Program has proven helpful to many residents over the years.




