PLANNING BOARD APPROVES REDEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR THE COLLECTION CHEVY CHASE

On September 8, the Montgomery County Planning Board considered The Chevy Chase Land Company's proposed plans to redevelop The Collection Chevy Chase (formerly referred to as Chevy Chase Center).

Chevy Chase Village Board Chair Mr. Michael Denger testified on behalf of the Village and he expressed appreciation for the Land Company's willingness to work with the community and to modify aspects of the plans to address concerns expressed by the Village regarding pedestrian and vehicular navigation and safety. Consistent with the Village's statement, submitted for the record on August 4, 2016, Mr. Denger also testified that the Village continues to have concerns regarding the lack of a final parking management plan for the property as well as the potential need for an additional speed hump at the south end of the property (just south of the entrance/exit to the Buffer) should the Land Company not complete the proposed traffic roundabout on Montgomery Street.

In response to these concerns, the Planning Board approved the proposed plans for the property, conditioned upon the Planning Staff's approval of the final speed hump locations prior to the Department of Permitting Services' issuance of the applicable permits.

The Village Board thanks the many residents who attended the initial information meeting in May as well as the final position meeting in August, responded to the questionnaire, and provided questions, comments and general feedback regarding the proposed plans; all of which helped to inform the Board's position and testimony to the Planning Board.

HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Village's contractor collects recyclable metals, plastics, glass and mixed paper every **Wednesday** from households **west** of Connecticut Avenue and every **Thursday** from households **east** of Connecticut Avenue. As with household refuse, recycling is collected from the rear of the premises; residents are not permitted to leave trash nor recycling receptacles at the curbside.

The Village participates in a "single-stream" recycling program, meaning that all recyclables can be commingled and placed in the **Green** recycling totes (if you have not yet received a tote, please email ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov to request delivery). (Recycling materials must *not* be placed in plastic bags.)

Commingled Glass, Metal and Plastics

- **Glass:** All jars and bottles (all colors).
- **Metal:** All aluminum and steel food and beverage cans and aluminum foil products such as balled foil wraps, and foil cookware. Please empty and rinse cans and foil products.
- **Plastics:** All plastic bottles can be recycled. Please empty and rinse bottles and discard the caps.

Mixed Paper

- Newspaper and all advertising inserts
- Magazines and glossy paper products, mail order catalogs, etc.
- Cardboard: cereal boxes, packing boxes, etc. (Please flatten large cardboard boxes and set with/beside the bin)
- Telephone books, paperback books and
- Plain paper; unwanted mail; computer paper

All non-recyclable materials should be placed in the regular trash.

To discard of bulk items that are less than 100 pounds, please contact the Village's 24-hour Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to schedule a special pick-up. Special pick-ups are collected every Wednesday by our in-house Public Works Department. Requests for pick-up must be received by 2:00 p.m. on the immediately preceding Tuesday.



ANNUAL LEAF COLLECTION

TAX RETURN REMINDER

Revenues received through our residents' paid income taxes remain the most significant source of Village revenues. We need our residents' help to ensure that all income tax revenue due to the Village actually gets here. This money goes directly to services benefiting Village residents.

As Village residents you DO NOT pay any additional income taxes to live in Chevy Chase Village. By law, as a municipality, the Village receives a portion of the tax you pay to Montgomery County. It is very important, however, that the State of Maryland knows to return this revenue to the Village.

When you file your Maryland income tax return, please remember to type CHEVY CHASE VILLAGE under "City, Town or Taxing Area" to ensure the Village receives our share of the state income tax.

Residents on Bradley Lane are required to bag their leaves before placing them at the roadside. Bradley Lane leaf bags will be collected throughout the week, as part of your normal yard waste collections. **If you bag your leaves, they must be placed in paper bags.** Public Works will not pick up leaves that have been bagged in plastic.

Residents and their lawn care contractors are asked to rake their leaves as close to the curb as possible without putting them in the roadway gutter. Please inform your landscape crews of this requirement. Should it rain, leaves piled in the gutter will dam the water causing it to pond. Please avoid boxing in piles of leaves between cars both for easier accessibility for the collection crews and safety for your vehicles.

Sticks and other sharp tree and garden debris should be left loose and placed in separate piles from leaves. Sharp debris can tear the leaf collection hoses or dull the blades, resulting in downtime for the machine to allow for repairs to the vacuum machinery that can cause delays in the schedule.

Leaves on each block in the Village should be collected once per week. Schedule updates will be circulated through the Village's weekly blast emails.

MEDICATION DROP BOX AVAILABLE AT THE VILLAGE HALL



The Village Police Department has a grant-funded steel drop box for the safe disposal of unwanted/unneeded prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medication. The white mailbox-style receptacle is located in the hallway to the left of the lobby area in the Village Hall and it is available to residents 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Residents are welcome to drop off bagged prescription and OTC pills (if in their containers, obliterate names on the labels). No liquids, needles, or empty pill bottles please!

HOME SECURITY SURVEYS

The Village Police Department offers free confidential home security surveys. These surveys are used as a tool to identify weak areas of your home's security. Simple remedies can make your home safer and more secure.

Interested residents should contact the Village Communications Center at (301) 654-7300 to request a Home Security Survey. A police officer will contact you to arrange a convenient time to conduct the survey.

PROTECTING YOUR FINANCIAL HEALTH AND YOUR CREDIT RATING REQUIRES SENSIBLE SECURITY HABITS

Identity theft is the fastest growing crime in America and it can happen to anyone. The National Crime Prevention Council offers the following tips:

- Do not give out your personal information unless you initiate the contact or know the person or company with whom you are dealing. Also, never disclose personal information, such as a Social Security number or bank account number in response to an email or a phone call. Legitimate businesses will not ask you to do this.
- Do not disclose your credit card number to an online vendor unless it is encrypted and the site is secure. Look at the first part of the Web address on your browser. It should read <https://>.
- Do not write your Social Security number on checks or credit card receipts.
- Remove all documents with personal information from your hard drive before discarding your computer or sending it in for repair.
- Shred discarded documents, including preapproved credit card applications, bank statements, store receipts and utility bills. "Dumpster divers" can gain access to your personal information if such items are thrown in the trash or recycle bins.
- Cancel all credit cards that have not been used in the last six months. Open credit is a prime target for thieves.
- Order your credit report at least twice a year and report any mistakes to the credit reporting agency in writing.

If you are a victim of identity theft, contact the Village Police Department as soon as possible. To learn more about preventing identity theft, visit the National Crime Prevention Council's Web site at www.ncpc.org.

OCTOBER-DECEMBER IN THE VILLAGE HALL

For the fourth year in a row, Chevy Chase Village will partner with the Manna Food Center, the largest food bank in Montgomery County. Over the past 33 years, Manna has distributed 47.3 million pounds of food to more than 2.7 million individuals in need of food assistance. Manna serves approximately 3,700 individuals monthly totaling 11,000 unduplicated households each year. The services of Manna ensure that 21,000 adults and 15,000 children who are experiencing poverty, hunger, and food insecurity will receive essential food supports to help them break the cycle of hunger and food insecurity.



What can you do? We will have a food drop-off at the Village Hall beginning in October through December. When attending Village events (classes, Board Meetings, Fall Social, Halloween Party, Holiday Party...), residents are asked to bring an item to add to the box. Here are some ideas: peanut butter, tuna fish, beans, oatmeal, mac and cheese, pasta, baby food, and shelf-stable milk.


