ARE YOU PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY?

As we experienced during the record Blizzard of 2016 and as we move into this winter season, the Village reminds residents that it is important to be prepared. In order to assist residents in their preparedness, the Village, in partnership with the Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security (OEMHS) offers the following helpful tools, plans and free alerts to assist and keep you informed.

Village Website and Blast Email System – Have you signed up for the Village’s blast email system? This is our primary electronic method of communication with residents. The Village has 2 email lists you can sign-up for:

Urgent News Alert – include messages such as criminal activity, neighborhood disruptions such as water main breaks, power outages and road closures and major weather events.

General News Alerts – include messages about Board and committee meetings, community events, changes in public services such as refuse/recycling collection schedules and upcoming road closures.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Public Works staff will collect trees, natural wreath and garlands left at the curbside.

Please remove all ornaments and lighting. The trees are recycled into mulch and any wires left on the trees will damage the chipping equipment. Wire-framed wreaths and wire-strung garland should be disposed of in the regular trash.



SNOW REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS



Residents are responsible for clearing all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of or abutting their property within the first forty-eight (48) hours after the cessation of falling snow.

Residents who occupy corner lots are responsible for the sidewalk in front of and on the side of their property.

TREE PLANTING INCENTIVE PROGRAM

A few years ago, the Village's Board of Managers created a Tree Planting incentive Program to provide cost-sharing assistance to residents who plant trees meeting specified requirements on their private property.

Under the Tree Incentive Program, the Village will reimburse residents for up to half of the total costs to a maximum of \$175 for the purchase and planting of qualifying canopy trees on privately owned properties. The total gross cost (including sales tax) will be calculated before any other state, county or other subsidies are applied. **Qualifying canopy tree species include White Ash, American Linden, Red and Sugar Maples, various Oak (White, Swamp White, Shingle, Willow, Water, Scarlet and Red), American Sycamore, London Plane, Bald Cypress, Sweet and Black Gum, American Beech, disease-resistant varieties of American Elm, Kentucky Coffee and Tulip Poplar.** Finally, purchased trees must be two and one half inches (2 1/2") in caliper or greater at the time of planting to qualify for the incentive. Residents interested in receiving reimbursement under the program must complete an application (available on the Village website and in the Village's administrative office). Applications will be acted upon in the order they are received. Additionally, applicants for Tree Removal Permits will be refunded their permit filing fee if they plant a canopy tree within six months of receiving a Village Tree Removal Permit.

DID YOU KNOW?

A listing of helpful reminders and information

- The **Village Hall** is a wonderful venue to hold various types of events including parties, receptions, and meetings. Visit the Village website at www.chevy ChaseVillageMD.gov and click on the Village Hall Rentals and Activities link under the "Services" menu for more information regarding renting the Village Hall for your next event.
- As mandated by the Village Code (Section 25-7), residents are required to **remove and clear away all snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of or abutting their property within the first 48 hours after the cessation of falling snow, sleet, or freezing rain**, except sidewalks along Brookville Road and Connecticut Avenue, which are cleared by Public Works personnel.
- The Communications Center maintains a photo album of Village residents' pets as part of our **Pet ID Program**. The purpose of this program is to return lost and found household pets to their rightful owners as soon as possible. Contact the Village Communications Center to register your pet.
- Residents may leave a spare house or vehicle key in the "**Resident Key File**" at the Communications Center in case of an emergency. If a resident, or someone authorized by the resident, is locked out of their home and/or vehicle, they can retrieve the spare key from the Village Communications Center any time, day or night.
- Are you Composting? Residents that are interested in signing up for participation in the composting collection service by The Compost Crew should sign-up via **The Compost Crew** website located at www.compostcrew.com. If you have any questions regarding the program, please do not hesitate to contact The Compost Crew directly at 301-202-4450 or via email at info@thecompostcrew.com.
- The Village Public Works Department is responsible for **snow removal from all Village streets**, except Brookville Road and Connecticut Avenue, which are maintained by the State. In the event of heavy snow, sleet, or freezing rain, the Village crew will plow the streets clear of snow and will treat the pavement with abrasives to allow for safe passage.

THEFTS FROM UNLOCKED CARS CONTINUE, BUT OVERALL CRIME REMAINS LOW

While crime in the Village continues to be low overall, our most prevalent crime category continues to be theft. By far, the leading form of theft (or attempt) is centered around unlocked vehicles parked overnight. In 2016, as all other crime categories remained low, the total number of thefts—74—was on par with 2015, and this statistic dominates our crime numbers. We know that the thieves simply walk through the neighborhood and pull on car door handles, and they enter the cars that they find unlocked. We are simply making it too easy for thieves to enter our cars. We need your help to reduce this number, and all you have to do is lock your car every time you park. Please make a habit of it.

The only other crime type that recurs with any frequency is burglary (unlawful entry of a home or other building with the intent to steal). During 2016, we recorded four burglaries; three of them involved the forcible entry of a home, and one was the theft of a bicycle from an open garage. A suspect has been identified in two of the break-ins, and an arrest is pending.

Our relationship with the Montgomery County Police Department and the Metropolitan Police Department is excellent, and we routinely share information to prevent crime and identify thieves and other criminals. The crimes that we experience in the Village are the same ones that occur in all of the surrounding communities. We urge you to do your part to prevent crime in the Village. Failing to do so effects the wider community by providing continuing opportunities for criminals. We feel that crime prevention is a civic responsibility, by doing a few simple things, you can prevent crime on your block:

- Always lock your home and car and set your alarms;
- Remove valuables from your cars;
- Turn on your porch lights and leave them on through the night;
- Request a house check when you are going away; and,
- Call the police immediately when you see anyone or hear anything that just doesn't seem right. Village officers will respond right away.

JOIN THE CREW; *THE COMPOST CREW*

Food-waste recycling--otherwise known as "composting"--is a great way to reduce your carbon footprint and greenhouse emissions while returning nutrients to our soil and food system.

The Village has partnered with *The Compost Crew* to provide low-cost household collection of food-waste. *The Compost Crew* provides each household with an airtight bin and compostable bags; all you have to do is separate your organic waste and leave the bin by your trash and recycling receptacles for collection on the designated day for weekly pick-up. The collected waste is processed at a composting facility in Maryland and, after six months of service, households can request that a portion of your contributed waste be returned in the form of rich, finished compost or nutrient-rich soil.

TAX RETURN REMINDER (MD FORM 502)

Revenues received through our residents' paid income taxes remain the most significant source of Village revenues. We need our residents' help to ensure that all income tax revenue due to the Village actually gets here. This money goes directly to services benefiting Village residents. **Village residents DO NOT pay any additional income taxes to live in Chevy Chase Village.** By law, as a municipality, the Village receives a portion of the tax you pay to Montgomery County. It is very important, however, that the State of Maryland knows to return this revenue to the Village. Consequently, please take special care to mark your tax return as shown below (if filing electronically, there is a character limit, therefore, you may have to use the abbreviation "Ch Ch Village").

See instruction 6. Part-year residents see instruction 20.

When you complete your Maryland income tax return, remember to put **Chevy Chase Village** under "Maryland Political Subdivision" to ensure the Village receives our share of the state income tax (see right). Please be aware that MD Form 502 has been **updated** this year with a separate political subdivision section located under your mailing address.







Proposed 2017 Spring Public Right-of-Way and Park Tree Planting



DEAR VILLAGE RESIDENT: In keeping with the Village’s adopted policy, the Village anticipates planting 45 trees this coming spring. Please review the following list of sites under consideration for planting in Village rights-of-way. The list has been prepared by the Tree Committee in consultation with the Village Arborist.

Should you have request for a different species, or if you have questions or concerns or would like to propose an additional site, **please submit them in writing to the Village office, c/o Tree Committee at ccv@montgomerycountymd.gov by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 28, 2017 including your name, address and telephone number. A member of the Tree Committee will contact you to discuss the matter.**

In selecting tree species, an effort has been made to emphasize native species and, where there are power lines, to plant trees that will not exceed 35’ when mature. Preferred species may in some cases prove not to be available and all listed sites are unlikely to be planted this spring. In these cases, the Tree Committee will contact the owner of the adjacent property to review alternatives.
