

Attempt Nighttime Burglary Early Wednesday Morning

At 2:35 a.m. on Wednesday, October 9, a resident in the 6000 block of Western Avenue was awakened by his home's burglar alarm. The resident investigated and noticed that the gate to the back yard was open, so he requested the police to respond. Village officers arrived very quickly, and their investigation revealed that unknown person(s) propped a garage window sash open in an apparent attempt to enter the garage. There was no sign of actual entry, and nothing was taken. Officers scoured the area looking for suspects without success. The sound of the alarm apparently scared of the would-be intruder(s).
