**GENERAL ORDER: 3-2.1 BOUNDARIES AND CONCURRENT
JURISDICTION**

I. BOUNDARIES

The boundaries of Chevy Chase Village can be loosely described as: Wisconsin Avenue on the west; Western Avenue on the south; Primrose Street on the east, and Bradley Lane on the north, but excluding the Chevy Chase Country Club. The specific boundaries are described in the CCV Code, Section 77.2.

It is the policy of the Department that all Village police officers shall be provided with a map of the Village and its boundaries, and with one-on-one field training so that they will learn and retain the Village boundaries prior to being released from the Field Training Program. Field Training Officers will be responsible for documenting this training.

II. AREAS OF SPECIFIC JURISDICTION

- A. Chevy Chase Club
Chevy Chase Village Police (CCVPD) will only take calls occurring on the sidewalk and street in front of the Club. The Montgomery County Police Department (MCPD) handles all calls on the grounds of the Club itself.
- B. Saks 5th Avenue (5555 Wisconsin Avenue)
CCVPD will take calls occurring in the parking lot of this location. All calls for service from inside the building and on the street in front of the building will be taken by MCPD. If MCPD is unavailable CCVPD will handle calls inside Saks.
- C. Western Avenue
CCVPD will take all calls occurring at the residences located within the Village along Western Avenue. The Washington D.C. boundary extends forty feet north of the north curb of Western Avenue. The Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) is responsible for all incidents within D.C.
- D. Wisconsin Avenue
All calls for service occurring on Wisconsin Avenue will be handled by the MCPD.

- E. Western Grove Park (5409 Grove Street)
All calls for service occurring on the property will be handled by CCVPD.

III. CONCURRENT JURISDICTION

Chevy Chase Village is in Montgomery County and therefore falls within the jurisdiction of the Montgomery County Police. CCVPD will provide the highest degree of cooperation and assistance to members of other law enforcement agencies consistent with departmental policies, procedures, and the terms of existing inter-agency agreements. There is an understanding with the Montgomery County Emergency Communications Center (ECC) that Village officers will be dispatched first to calls for service inside the boundaries of Chevy Chase Village.

- A. If there is a call for service in the Village and there are no other Village officers available for backup, ECC will dispatch an MCPD officer(s) as necessary.
- B. If there is a call for service in the Village and all Village officers are busy on another call, ECC will dispatch MCPD officer(s) as necessary.
- C. Village officers may be asked to backup units outside of the Village by the ECC dispatcher or another supervisory MCPD unit as needed. (See G.O. 3 - 2, Law Enforcement Authority)
- D. Village officers may be asked to handle calls for service outside of the Village by the ECC dispatcher or MCPD supervisor in extreme cases where the County has no other units available or an emergency exists.
