

March 2018 CCVPD Highlights

Crime/Operational

1. **Stolen vehicle:** A car was reported stolen from a resident in the middle block of Grafton Street overnight March 8-9. Since it was taken, the residents have received several photo speed citations from DC in the mail. The car was taken on the same night that 5 nearby residents reported that their unlocked cars were entered. The investigation is continuing.
2. **We had 9 thefts from unlocked vehicles in March.** Two incidents occurred during daytime hours and the remainder occurred overnight—five of which occurred on the same night.
 - **Daytime 3/5:** Oxford between Connecticut and Brookville; unlocked construction vehicle; wallet containing \$800 cash stolen
 - **Overnight 3/8-3/9:** W. Irving between Magnolia and Cedar; Grafton between Cedar and Kirkside; Montgomery between Kirkside and the Buffer; and Chevy Chase Circle.
 - **Daytime 3/10:** Park between Kirkside and Belmont; clothing stolen and recovered a block away
 - **Overnight 3/14-3/15:** Quincy between Connecticut and Brookville; change and sunglasses taken
 - **Overnight 3/24-3/25:** 5600 block of Western Avenue; nothing taken

Personnel and Administrative

1. Our newest police officer, Ryan Patterson, began his training with us on Wednesday, April 4. When he completes his training, we will once again be at full staffing in patrol.
2. We have been interviewing applicants for our dispatcher vacancy; we hope to select a candidate very soon.
3. This year's body camera/PIA bill (SB788) failed due to opposition by the ACLU.
4. The Village Manager has signed a contract with Optotraffic to provide us with digital parking citation services along with related devices and support. This will save our officers time, improve our courtroom presentation, and will cost no more than our current arrangement with Montgomery County.

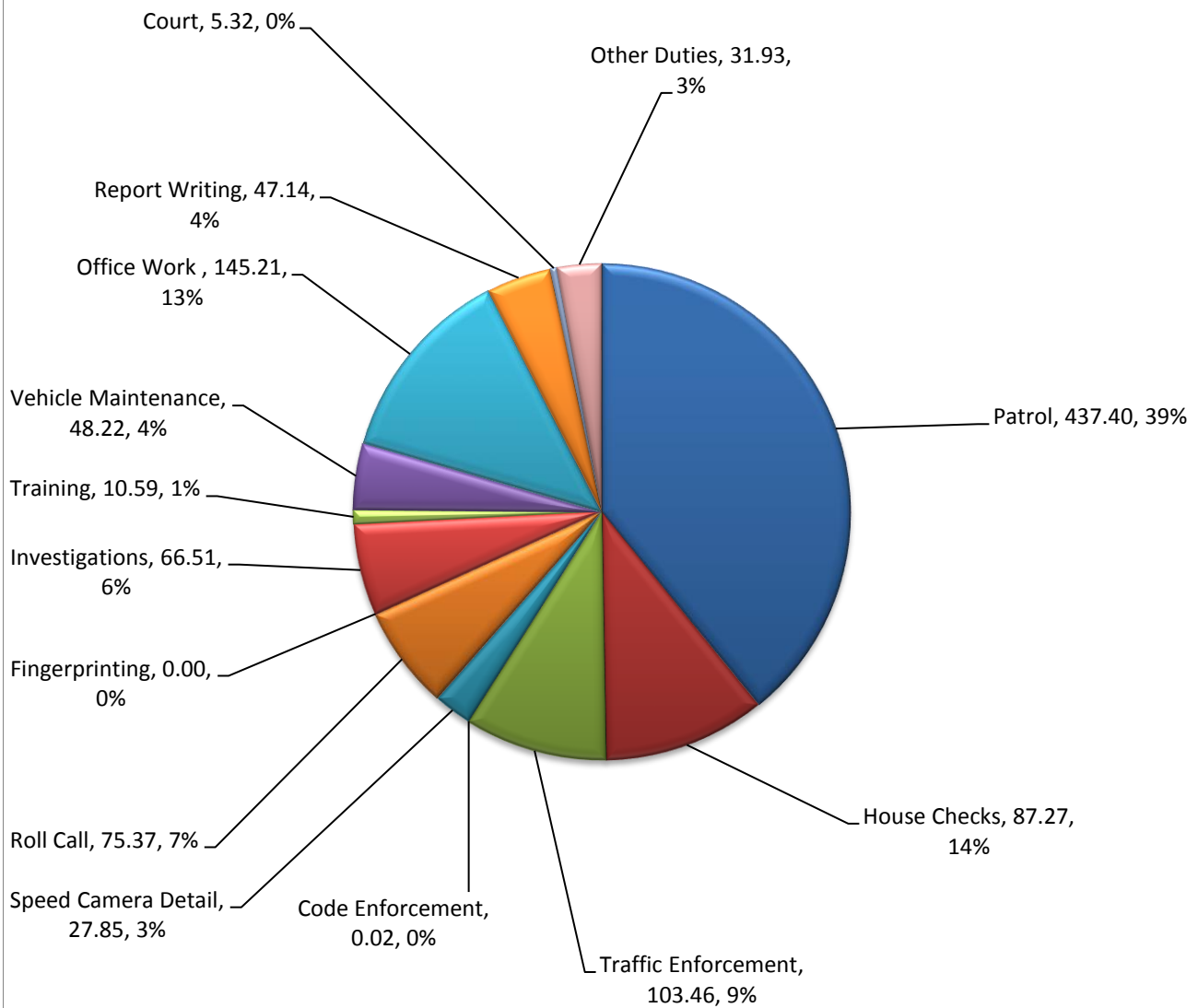

Chevy Chase Village Police Department Officer Hours for March 2018 within Chevy Chase Village

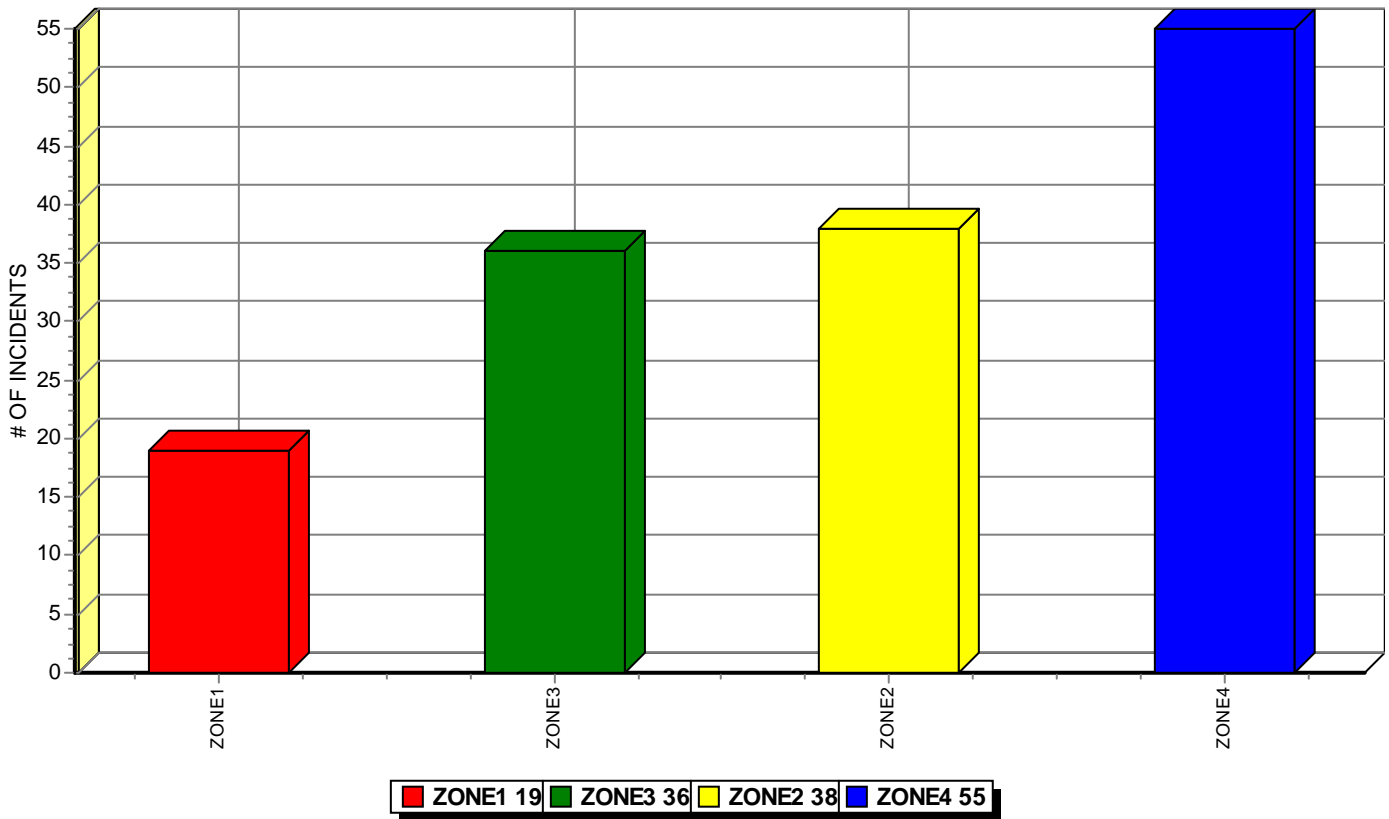

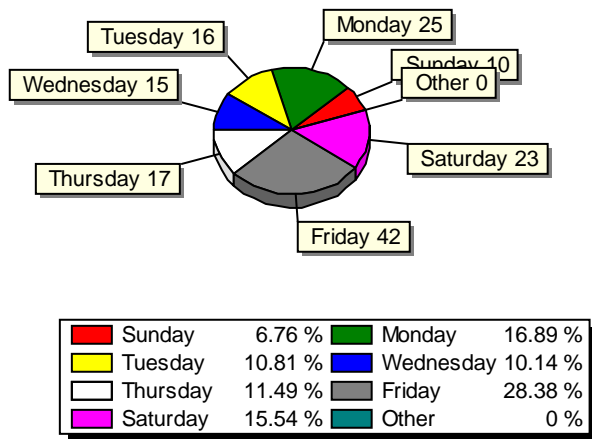

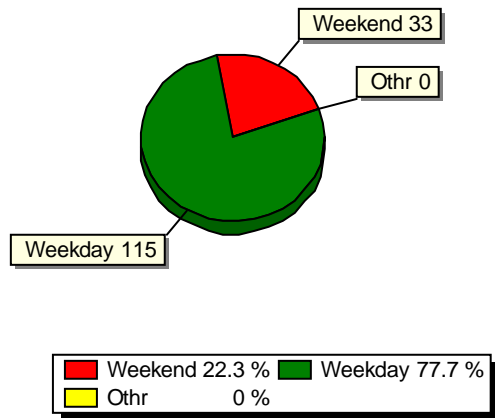
Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)
