

July 2021 CCVPD Highlights

I. Reported Crime

NOTES: 1. The below robberies are not related to one another. 2. Prior to the below armed robbery on July 4, the last robbery in the Village occurred on March 13, 2014.

- **Armed robbery on the middle block of Hesketh Street**

On July 4 at 2:35 a.m., two women who are friends were talking outside as one of the victims was preparing to drive home following an evening visit. As the pair chatted, a black sedan pulled up and two men got out of the car and approached the victims. One of the men pointed a handgun at each of the victims, and he punched one of the women in the face. The robbers demanded that the victims hand over their property, and the suspects stole two cell phones, a wallet and other personal items.

The suspects, described as black males, slender to medium builds, dressed in all black and wearing face coverings, drove away in a black car. Village Officer Fones and multiple County officers responded. County Police detectives are following up.

- **Armed robbery of Village resident in DC on Western Avenue near Cedar Parkway**

A woman taking a morning walk was confronted by a man on foot who raised his sweatshirt to display a gun in his waist band as he demanded that she hand over her purse. The woman complied. The suspect is described as a medium-complexioned black male, about 50 years old, approximately six feet tall, with a slender build, a well-trimmed grey (salt-and-pepper) goatee, shaved bald head, wearing a black crew neck sweatshirt, black sweat pants, bright red sneakers and a black cloth COVID face covering which he pulled down when he spoke to the victim.

DC Police detectives are following up.

The Village Police Department issued email blasts to our community within hours of each of the above events to get the word out quickly. Following the second robbery, Chief Fitzgerald issued a message to Village residents to provide them with additional information regarding the ongoing investigations and to reassure residents that the Police Department was working to keep them safe.

II. Administrative

- Allison Shumake, one of our nighttime Communications Clerks, resigned effective July 30. Her replacement, Ms. Sally DaCosta, will start July 9 and she will be in training for approximately 4 weeks.
 - At the direction of the Board Chair pursuant to a request from the Public Safety Committee, Chief Fitzgerald researched data to evaluate the effectiveness of the current policy dealing with complaints of loud leaf blowers. The data showed that complaints were down significantly, and that the current policy was effective. Chief Fitzgerald reported the findings to the Board Chair.
 - Chief Fitzgerald has applied for a 1:1 federal grant (through BJA) for body-worn cameras; Chief will keep the Board informed about the grant.

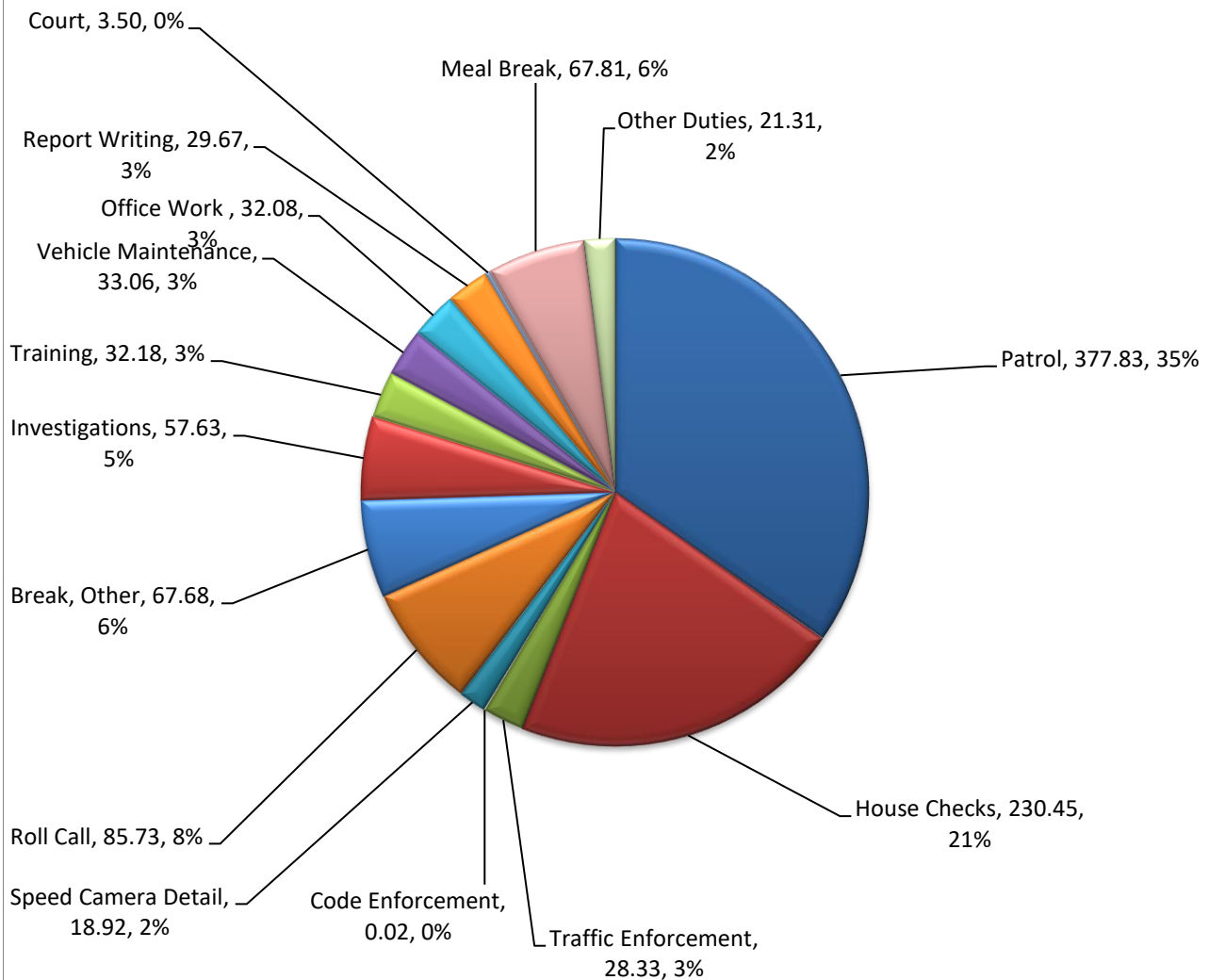

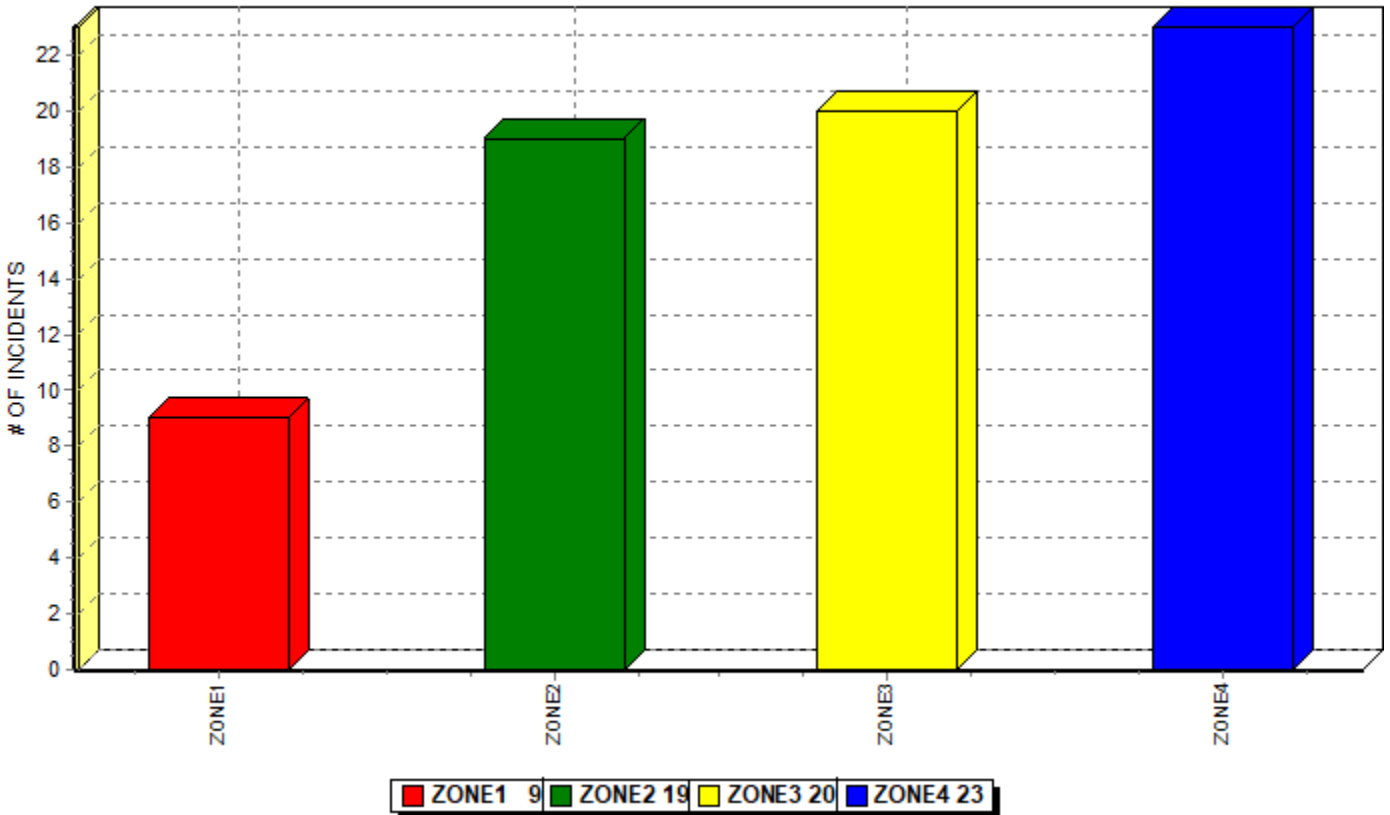

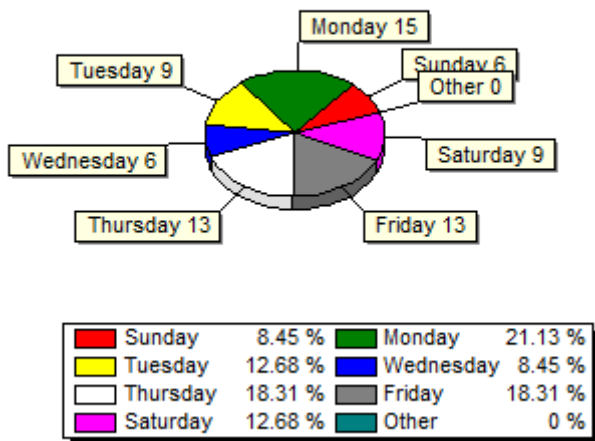

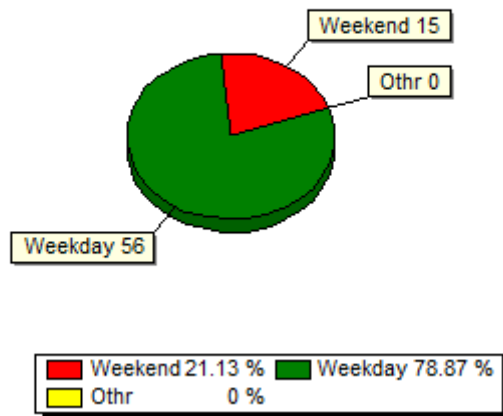
Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)



By Day of Week

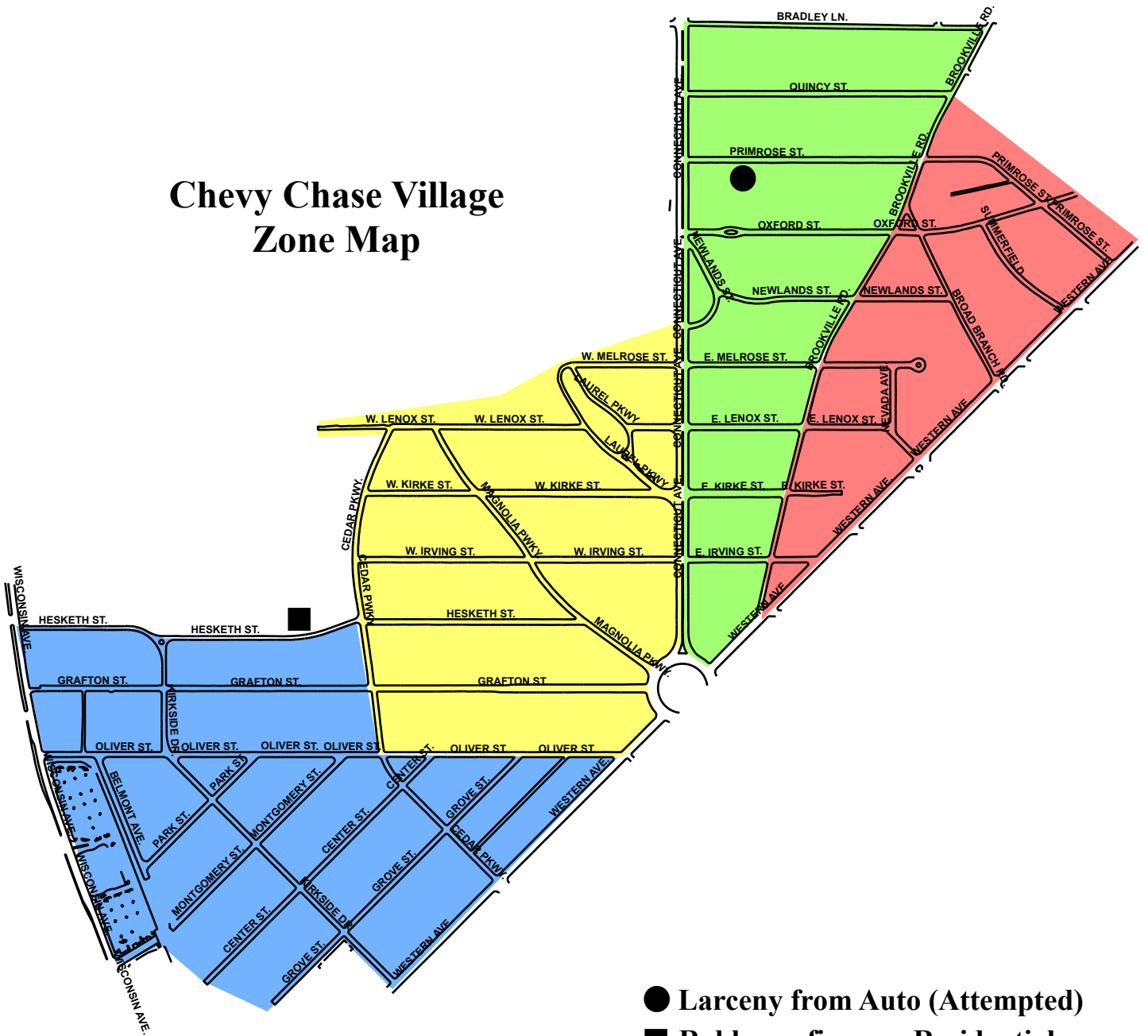


Weekday vs Weekend
