

## August 2021 CCVPD Highlights

### I. Operational

- **Protesters disrupt traffic briefly:** On Monday, August 23, a group of environmental activists from an organization entitled ShutdownDC marched in Washington protesting the construction of oil pipelines. That same evening, they marched in the NB lanes of Connecticut Avenue from Chevy Chase Circle to a federal official’s home on a side street in the Town. Village and County police had short notice of this demonstration, but were able to coordinate a plan in conjunction with federal law enforcement. County Police made some arrests at the marchers’ destination and the remaining protesters ultimately dispersed.
- **Only one attempted theft reported all month:** At about 6:00 a.m. on August 21, a resident saw a suspicious man pulling on car door handles on Grafton Street between Kirkside and Wisconsin. Officers responded immediately, but the suspect was gone. During a neighborhood canvass, officers found that one unlocked car had been entered, but nothing was stolen.

### II. Administrative

- The Village Manager and Chief Fitzgerald have been working with County representatives to develop a reimbursement formula to resolve the municipal tax duplication problem.
- Our newest Communications Clerk, Sally DaCosta, continues her training under Lead Communications Clerk Regina Cortez.

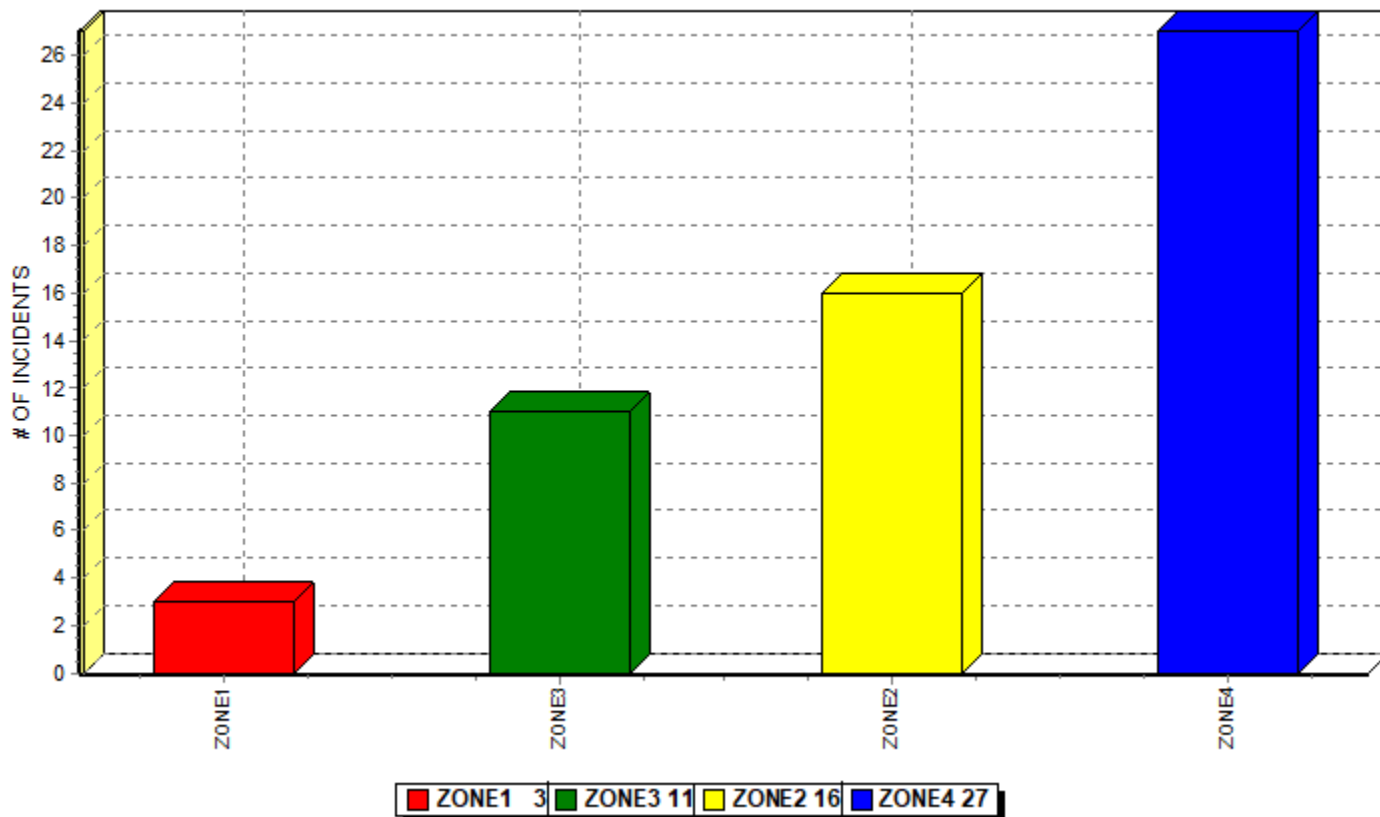

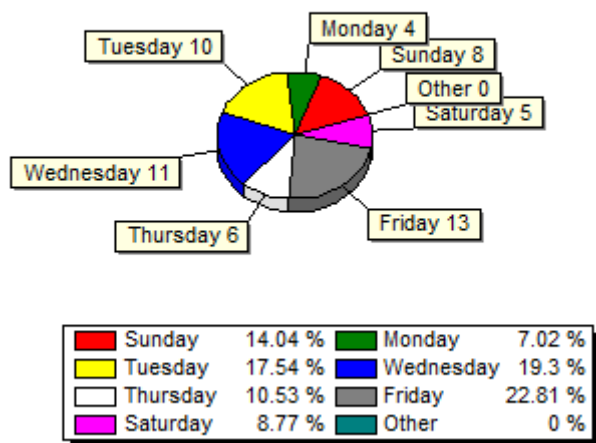

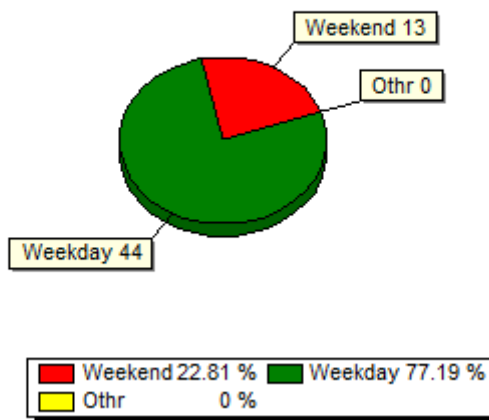
**Incident Frequency by DISTRICT (Top 4 of 4 Shown) (Using DATE RECD)**



**By Day of Week**

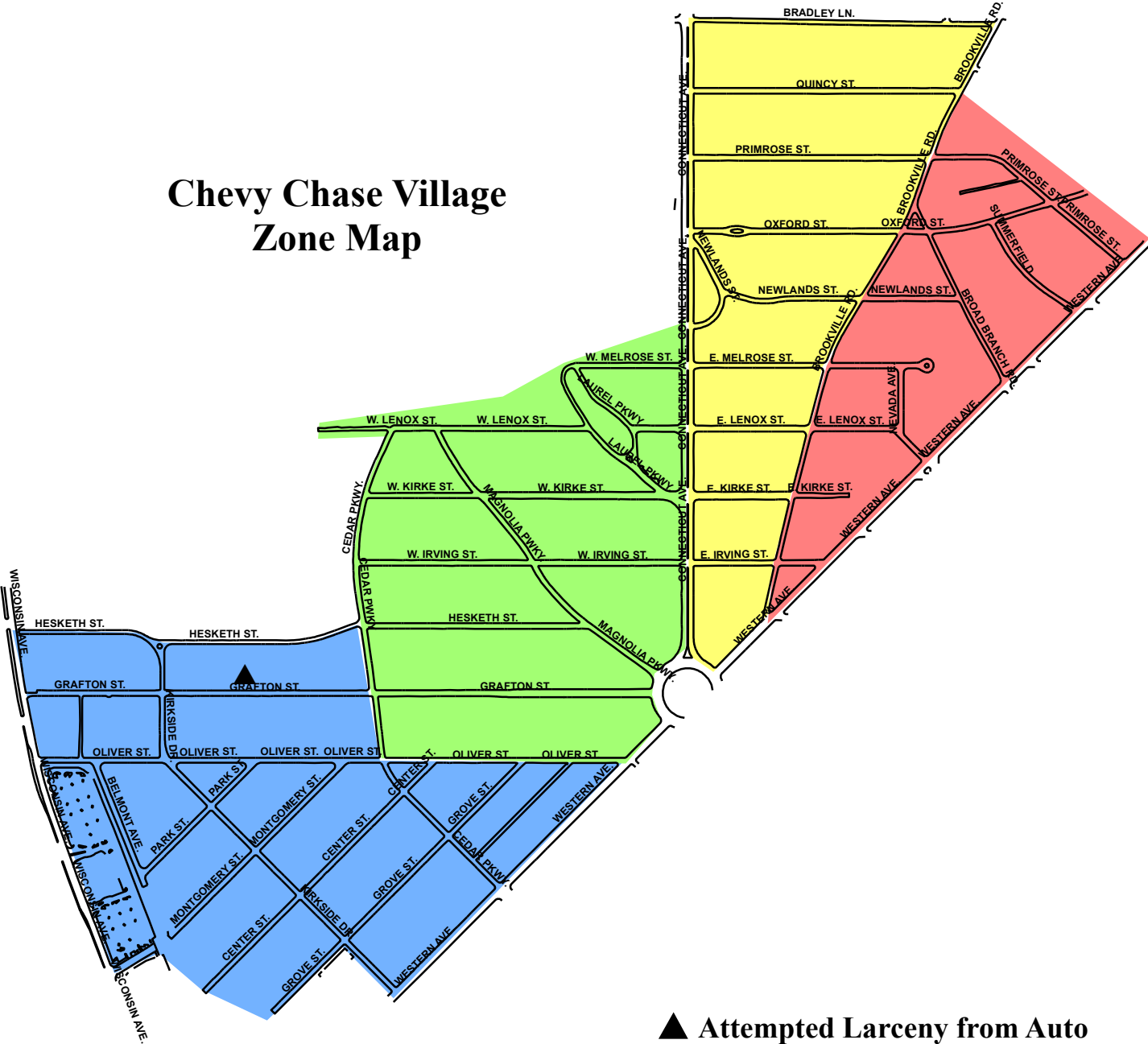


**Weekday vs Weekend**
